Comment

Multi-year measure, to be reported following the event in late-2023/early-2024.

Early outcomes directly following the event suggest both measures have been or will be met. The tournament was delivered successfully, with post-event reporting now underway.

An all-of-government Outcomes Framework was developed to prioritise agency mahi and a \$10 million Leverage and Legacy Fund was launched for Crown agencies and mana whenua aligned with Host Cities to deliver projects for FIFA WWC. The Leverage and Legacy programme is now in delivery mode, with a strong programme across schools, community engagement, and projects that celebrate women and girls in sport and wider society. Post-event reporting and an independent evaluation is due late 2023, which will provide an overview of this mahi and outcomes achieved.

Comment

This appropriation was established as part of the Supplementary Estimates of Appropriations 2021/22. Funding of \$39.100 million was transferred from the *Economic and Regional Development: 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup 2020-2024* MYA and *Economic Development: Major Events Development Fund 2017-2022* MYA to create the appropriation under the new Sports and Recreation portfolio. This reflects the Minister for Sport and Recreation as being the lead Minister for FIFA compliance costs for host cities, stadiums and training venues.

The spend for the 2022/23 financial year was \$23.710 million. The remaining funding of \$19.240 million will be carried forward to 2023/24 and confirmed in the 2023 October Baseline Update process.
