3 Why network operator status is **necessary** for the applicant?

4 Will the declaration of network operator status **enable** the applicant to **commence** or **carry on** a business providing facilities for telecommunication¹ between 10 or more other persons that enable at least 10 of those persons to communicate with each other?

¹ "Telecommunication" for the purposes of the Telecommunications Act 2001 is defined in section 5 as "the conveyance by electromagnetic means from one device to another of any encrypted or non-encrypted sign, signal, impulse, writing, image, sound, instruction, information, or intelligence of any nature, whether for the information of any person using the device or not" and depending on which part of the act, it may or may not include "any conveyance that constitutes broadcasting."

5 Will the declaration of network operator status **enable** the applicant to **commence** or **carry on** a business providing facilities for broadcasting² to 500 or more other persons that enable programmes to be transmitted along a line or lines to each of those persons?

6 The following information should also be included with any application:

- Company's Certificate of Incorporation.
- Details of the company's history.
- Detailed maps of telecommunications rollout plans.

² "Broadcasting" is defined in s2(1) of the Broadcasting Act 1989 as "any transmission of programmes, whether or not encrypted, by radio waves or other means of telecommunication for reception by the public by means of broadcasting receiving apparatus but does not include any such transmission of programmes – made on the demand of a particular person for reception only by that person; or made solely for performance or display in a public place."
