Draft Cabinet Legislation paper: Immigration (International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy) Amendment Bill

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Purpose

This paper provides you with a draft Cabinet Legislation Committee (LEG) paper for the *Immigration (International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy) Amendment Bill*, and a copy of this Bill. We recommend that the Minister of Tourism lead consultation with your Ministerial colleagues. We ask that you provide feedback to officials by Friday 10 May, to enable lodging of this paper on Thursday 16 May 2019.

Recommended action

The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment recommends that you:

Background

International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy

- In September 2018 Cabinet agreed to the collection mechanism for the International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy (IVL), and invited the Minister of Tourism to issue drafting instructions to Parliamentary Counsel Office (PCO) [DEV-18-MIN-0194].
- 2. Cabinet also authorised the Minister of Tourism to approve changes consistent with the policy proposals agreed to by Cabinet, or on any issues that arose during the drafting process. In April 2019 the Minister of Tourism agreed to a number of minor changes to enable the drafting of the Bill [MBIE briefing 2654 18-19].

Electronic Travel Authority

- In February 2019 Cabinet invited the Minister of Immigration to issue drafting instructions to PCO to give effect to the electronic travel authority (ETA), and also authorised him to approve changes consistent with the policy proposals and on any issues that arose during the drafting process.
- 4. In May 2019 MBIE recommended the Minister of Immigration make a number of minor policy changes to the ETA scheme [MBIE briefing 3278 18-19]. This includes approving a minor additional amendment to the Immigration Act 2009 (the Act) to enable automated decision making for the ETA.

Passage of the Bill

- The Minister of Tourism previously indicated his preference to pass the Bill under urgency on Budget night (Thursday 30 May 2019). On 15 April 2019 Cabinet agreed that the Bill would be considered under urgency on 30 May 2019 [CAB-19-Min-0174].
- In order to meet this timeframe LEG will need to consider the Bill on 21 May and Cabinet must approve the introduction of the Bill on 27 May 2019. A draft Cabinet Legislation paper is attached at Annex One, and the draft Bill is attached at Annex Two.

About the Bill

- 7. As previously advised, PCO recommends that the IVL is provided for via an amendment to the Immigration Act, rather than a standalone piece of legislation. This means the Bill is relatively short, as we have been able to rely on existing sections of the Act for certain powers (such as the power to make regulations).
- 8. The Bill:
 - modifies the purpose section of the Act to include a sub-clause that enables an IVL to be charged to fund, or contribute to the funding of, costs associated with conservation or tourism
 - amends the definition of Minister, to allow different Ministers to be responsible for parts of the Act, so that the Minister of Tourism can recommend the making of regulations in respect of the IVL (subject to allocation of ministerial responsibilities by the Prime Minister)
 - c. Adds a new section to the Act that allows for regulations to be made to charge the IVL, including:
 - i. who can be charged applicants for temporary entry class visas, and persons seeking to rely on a waiver under section 69 of the requirement to hold a temporary entry class visa (ie people requesting an ETA)

- ii. the purpose of the levy to fund or contribute to the funding of conservation and tourism
- iii. what the regulations may do specify who pays and who is exempt, set the levy amount, and provide for the manner of collection of the levy.
- d. Adds a new section to the Act that:
 - requires the Minister to consult with persons and organisations whom the Minister considers appropriate when making regulations (except for the first set of regulations)
 - ii. requires MBIE to review the amount of the IVL, at intervals of no more than every 5 years
- e. Modifies section 28 of the Act to enable automated decision making for the ETA (subject to the agreement of the Minister of Immigration).

Next steps

9. We recommend you forward the draft LEG paper and draft Bill to your Ministerial colleagues and provide any feedback to officials by Friday 10 May.
