## **Minimum Wage Review 2020**

#### Portfolio Workplace Relations and Safety

On 9 December 2020, the Cabinet Business Committee:

- **noted** the government's 2020 pre-election commitment to increase the adult minimum wage to \$20.00 per hour in 2021;
- agreed to increase the adult minimum wage from \$18.90 per hour to \$20.00 per hour;
- agreed to maintain the starting-out and training minimum wages at 80 percent of the adult minimum wage, which will mean that these each increase to \$16.00 per hour;
- 4 **agreed** that the minimum wage increases, noted in paragraphs 2 and 3 above, come into effect on 1 April 2021;
- 5 **invited** the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to these recommendations through an Order in Council:
- 6 **noted** that these changes to the minimum wages will be announced before the end of 2020.
