





#### **UFB PRODUCT MIX**

8.4% of New Zealand homes and businesses with a UFB connection have opted for the fastest product in the market





For husband and wife team Glenn and Lynda Gibson from Waipū, Northland, connecting to ultra-fast broadband (UFB) is a key part of running their successful business.

"My husband and I own Salt N Pepper café in Waipū, which we opened in October 2017," says Lynda. "Glenn is the chef and I run the front of house."

When they opened Salt N Pepper, it was important to Lynda and Glenn to have a reliable, high-speed internet connection. Because their café is located in a concrete building (which can result in poor Wi-Fi reception) they knew they needed an excellent connection in order to provide the best experience for their staff and customers.

"Ultra-fast broadband was an obvious choice, so we connected a few weeks after opening the café," says Lynda.

At Salt N Pepper, having a UFB connection helps the team with their day-to-day business activities. It ensures their internet-based Point of Sale system can always function as needed, and it also allows them to offer their staff and customers access to free Wi-Fi services in the café.

"A number of our staff are younger and prefer not to use up their data, so our free Wi-Fi helps them," says Lynda. "We also have a lot of overseas travellers who are looking to connect for free and catch up on all their communications. Some plug into our power and Wi-Fi and stay for a long time catching up – we don't have a problem with this, and they in turn advise their friends and other travellers about our free service, so it is a win-win situation."

The UFB rollout in Waipū was completed in May 2018. Waipū is one of the top 10 centres for UFB uptake this quarter with 59.3% of homes and businesses now connected – that's 365 homes and businesses connected out of 616 that are able to connect.
