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Executive summary

This report analyses data from the Ministry of Business, Innovation, and Employment's (MBIE's) Migrant Surveys 2021 and 2022 for respondents who were waged or salaried employees. The analysis aims to identify the extent to which migrant employees are experiencing adverse working conditions, and the particular migrant groups that are more at risk.

While most migrant employees did not report unfair treatment at work and were receiving the minimum employment entitlements asked about in the survey, some migrant workers were more vulnerable in their jobs. In particular, adverse working conditions and breaches of employment rights were more common for:

- > migrants working in industries and occupations that most commonly employed migrant men
- > migrants from specific countries such as the Philippines
- > migrants with lower English language proficiency and qualification levels
- > temporary migrants.

The overall extent to which specific types of unfair or adverse treatment and employment breaches were experienced by migrant employees, in their current main job, was as follows.

- > Seven per cent of migrant employees in 2021, and five per cent in 2022 responded that their employer withheld, or said they would withhold, entitlements like holiday pay or sick leave.
- > Four per cent each year had felt unsafe because of their current employer's behaviour.
- > Four per cent each year responded that their employer had asked/expected them to pay money to get or keep their job.
- Three per cent in 2021 and two per cent in 2022 were paid less than the adult minimum wage.
- > Two per cent in 2021 and one per cent in 2022 did not have a written employment agreement.
- > In 2022, five per cent of migrant workers contacted someone for help with their working conditions.
- > Four per cent of migrant workers in 2021 and three per cent in 2022 were not provided with support or information from their employer about any of the areas asked about in the survey, such as 'health and safety at work', 'welcoming you to the workplace' and 'supporting you or your family to settle in New Zealand'.
- > Twenty per cent of migrant employees in 2021 and eighteen per cent in 2022 responded that their job didn't match their qualifications and skills, with another eleven per cent each year responding that there was a partial match.
- > More than half of migrant workers each year felt they had been treated unfairly because they came from overseas, with 31 per cent of these workers in 2021 and 28 per cent in 2022 experiencing this unfair treatment while applying for a job.

Introduction

Since 2009, the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) has undertaken an annual survey of migrants as part of the Immigration Survey Monitoring Programme. The purpose of the Migrant Survey is to build an evidence base about migrants' settlement experiences and labour market outcomes.

Each year MBIE invites approximately 16,000 migrants to complete the survey (via a contracted research agency). Participation in the survey is voluntary and the data collected is treated confidentially. The survey is mostly completed online, and available in English, Simplified Chinese, Samoan, Spanish, Arabic, and Korean.

This report analyses data from the 2021 and 2022 Migrant Surveys for respondents who were waged or salaried employees. The analysis aims to identify the extent to which migrant employees are receiving their basic work rights and feel safe and supported in the workplace, and which groups are most vulnerable to mistreatment. Supplementary to this report is an appendix of results tables. It complements the results discussed and provides further data.



Survey background

The target population for the 2021 and 2022 Migrant Surveys was migrants who met the following criteria at the date of sample selection:

- > were aged 18 years or over and onshore in New Zealand
- > their current visa was approved under the Skilled/Business Stream (Principal and Secondary applicants), a Family category (Family Partnership and Family Parent) or a Work Stream (Essential Skills, Family, Post-study Work, Work to Residence, Working Holiday Scheme and Other)¹
- > had spent at least six months and no more than five years in total in New Zealand on a resident, work, or student visa prior to the sample selection date
- > had spent at least 50 per cent of their total elapsed time in New Zealand since their first arrival on a resident, work, or student visa prior to the sample selection date.

In 2021, the target population for the survey was broadened and the sample size increased to better reflect the changing mix of migrants onshore, and meet the expanding information needs of stakeholders (including the survey increasingly being used to inform MBIE's temporary migrant worker exploitation programme)². Accordingly, the sample for the 2021 survey onwards includes:

- > a greater proportion of temporary migrants
- > a wider respondent eligibility time frame, i.e. migrants who had spent at least six months and no more than five years in total in New Zealand³
- > the Pacific Access Category and the Samoan Quota groups (although these groups were not included in the 2022 survey)⁴.

Prior to 2021, MBIE's reporting from the Migrant Survey showed changes and trends across several years of survey results. Due to the expanded sample frame for the survey from 2021, this report examines the 2021 and 2022 survey results only.

The survey was completed by 5,015 migrants in 2021, and 5,594 in 2022. The survey data is weighted each year to reflect New Zealand's recent migrant population by visa stream and by country of nationality. In 2022, 54 per cent of those selected to take part in the survey were resident visa holders while in 2021 only 39 per cent were on a resident visa. In the future, it is expected that there will be a higher share of residents in the eligible survey population than in 2021. However, it is not expected that there will be a large one-off shift again like the change that occurred in the 2022 population.

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Prior to the 2021 survey, migrants eligible for the survey were those on work visas who arrived in New Zealand at least six months but no more than 12 months prior to selection and those on resident visas who arrived in New Zealand at least 12 months but no more than 18 months prior to selection.

⁴ The 2022 survey did not include migrants in the Pacific Access or Samoan Quota categories due to insufficient numbers for sampling after the pausing of these pathways during COVID-19 border closures. For consistency in reporting between the two years, the PAC and SQ migrants included in the 2021 survey were not included in the analysis for this report.

In both survey years, the weighted proportion of migrants working for wages or a salary was 86 per cent. This report only presents weighted results from the survey for recent migrants who were working as employees (referred to in this report as migrant employees/migrant workers).

The commentary in this report focuses on statistically significant differences in the survey results for sub-groups. Caution should be applied when using the data tables in the appendix to compare between other sub-groups or between years, as any differences that are not noted in the text are unlikely to be statistically significant.

Survey questions used in this analysis

In addition to using demographic information and data on job characteristics (occupation, industry, nationality, English conversation capability, highest qualification, gender, and number of jobs), the analysis in this report focuses on migrant employees' responses to the following survey questions.

- > In your current main job, are you paid LESS than the minimum wage before tax and any other deductions are taken out?
- > Do you have a written employment agreement for your main job that describes your work and conditions of employment?
- > Has your current employer ever asked you, or expected you, to pay money to them to get or keep your job?
- > Has your current employer ever withheld, or said they would withhold, entitlements like holiday pay or sick leave?
- > Have you ever felt unsafe because of your current employer's behaviour?
- > How well do you feel you understand your employment rights in New Zealand?
- > Since coming to New Zealand, how often have you felt someone was treating you unfairly because you came from overseas?
- > What were you doing when you experienced this treatment you felt was unfair? Please select all that apply⁵.
 - Applying for a job
 - Working with my manager, supervisor, or work colleagues
 - Working at a job dealing with an external client or customer
- > Has your current employer provided you with information on, or support with, the following areas? *Please* select all that apply.
 - Welcoming you to the workplace
 - Improving your English language skills
 - Supporting you or your family to settle in New Zealand
 - New Zealand work styles and communicating in the New Zealand workplace
 - Your employment rights and obligations
 - Health and safety at work (including mental health)
 - Bullying and unfair treatment at work (2022 only)
 - New Zealand tax system
 - KiwiSaver
 - Joining a union (if there is a union representing your workplace)



New Zealand's migrant worker population is diverse and well educated

For both 2021 and 2022, the top nationalities of migrant employees were people from India (21 per cent both years) and the Philippines (16 per cent in 2021, 17 per cent in 2022). About two-thirds of migrant employees had at least a Bachelor's degree (63 per cent in 2021, 66 per cent in 2022) and almost all reported speaking English 'well' or 'very well' (92 per cent in 2021, 93 per cent in 2022).

Gender plays a part in the occupations and industries worked in

Despite an overall even distribution of male and female workers in the New Zealand migrant population, the 'construction' (85 per cent male in 2021, 86 per cent in 2022) and 'manufacturing' (74 per cent male in 2021, 65 per cent in 2022) industries were male-dominated, as were the occupations 'technicians and trades workers' (85 per cent male in 2021, 80 per cent in 2022), 'managers' (60 per cent male in 2021), 'labourers' (58 per cent male in 2021, 57 per cent in 2022), and 'machinery operators and drivers' (89 per cent male in 2021, 77 per cent in 2022).

Female-dominated industries included 'healthcare and social assistance' (71 per cent female in 2021, 73 per cent in 2022), 'education and training' (78 per cent female in both years). Female-dominated occupations included 'community and personal support workers' (66 per cent female in 2021, 69 per cent in 2022), 'clerical and administration' (79 per cent female in 2021, 74 per cent in 2022), and 'sales workers' (60 per cent female in 2021, 69 per cent in 2022).

While most migrant employees held work visas in 2021, in 2022 it was more likely for migrant employees to be on resident visas

In 2021, 70 per cent of migrant employees were on work visas, and 30 per cent were on resident visas. In 2022, this reversed to 39 per cent of migrants on work visas, and 61 per cent on resident visas. This significant increase in resident visas was driven by the introduction of the one-off 2021 Resident Visa pathway for 'settled', 'scarce', and 'skilled' work visa holders⁶. Applications for this pathway to residence were open to work visa holders in New Zealand between 30 September 2021 and 31 July 2022.

The most common industry of work for migrant employees was healthcare and social assistance

In both years, migrant employees most commonly worked in the 'healthcare and social assistance' (18 per cent in 2021 and 21 per cent in 2022) and 'construction' (13 per cent in 2021 and 2022) industries and in 'professional' occupations (32 per cent in 2021 and 35 per cent in 2022) or as 'technicians and trades workers' (19 per cent in 2021 and 17 per cent in 2022). 


Figure 2: Industries worked in by migrant employees, 2021 and 2022




Figure 3: Occupations of migrant employees, 2021 and 2022

Migrant workers with better English language proficiency also had higher educational attainment

Self-reported English language proficiency of migrant employees was linked to educational attainment, with higher proficiency reported among those whose highest educational qualification was a Bachelor's degree or higher. In 2021, 93 per cent of those with a Bachelor's degree or higher spoke English well/very well compared to 89 per cent of those without a Bachelor's degree and in 2022, 95 per cent of those with a Bachelor's degree spoke English well/very well compared with 88 per cent without a Bachelor's degree. There was also an increase in English language capability among those with a Bachelor's degree or higher in 2022 compared to 2021.

Indian migrant employees were among the most likely to have postgraduate qualifications

Indian (46 per cent in 2021, 49 per cent in 2022) and Chinese migrants in 2021 (45 per cent in 2021) were the nationalities most likely to have postgraduate qualifications. In contrast, Pacific migrant employees were the most likely to report that their highest educational qualification was below a Bachelor's degree (81 per cent in 2021 and 65 per cent in 2022). Many Sri Lankan and American migrant workers also had postgraduate qualifications, with 30 per cent or more having postgraduate qualification in each survey year. In 2022, the proportion of Chinese migrants with postgraduate qualifications (at 36 per cent) was lower than for Sri Lankan (41 per cent) and American (42 per cent) migrants.

Some migrant workers have multiple jobs

More than five per cent of migrant employees had two jobs (six per cent in 2021 and seven per cent in 2022) and in 2022, one per cent had three jobs. Both years, those with two jobs were more likely (38 per cent in 2021, 42 per cent in 2022) to have a postgraduate qualification than those with one job (29 per cent in 2021, 31 per cent in 2022). Those with two jobs were also more likely to report that their current role in their main job didn't match their skills and qualifications (31 per cent of those with two jobs and 19 per cent of those with one job in 2021, 24 per cent of those with two jobs and 17 per cent of those with one job in 2022).

Few migrant employees had felt unsafe because of their current employer's behaviour

In both years, four per cent of migrant workers reported that they had felt unsafe because of their current employer's behaviour.

Migrant employees who sought help with their working conditions most often contacted their union

In 2022, five per cent of migrant workers contacted someone (who wasn't a family member or friend) for help with problems about their working conditions. It was most common for these workers to have contacted a union (20 per cent) or a solicitor/lawyer (14 per cent) for help. See Table 1 below.

Migrants who felt their job didn't match their skills and qualifications had often chosen to pursue a different career/job in New Zealand or could not find a job in their area of qualifications/skills

A similar proportion each year (20 per cent in 2021, 18 per cent in 2022) reported their job did not match their skills and qualifications, with a further 11 per cent each year saying their job partially matched their skills and qualifications. Of those without a job that matched their skills and qualifications, more were over-qualified (twenty per cent in 2021, twenty-three per cent in 2022) than under-qualified (two per cent in 2021, one per cent in 2022). In 2022 the most common reported reason for a mismatch was by choice (43 per cent in 2022), followed by difficulty finding a job that matched skills and qualifications in New Zealand (34 per cent in 2022). In 2021, similar proportions of those with a skills mismatch had chosen to pursue a different career/job in New Zealand (38 per cent in 2021) and had been unable to get a job in their field (37 per cent in 2021). See Table 2 below.

Across the two survey years, migrants working as 'professionals' were the most likely of all occupation groups to report that their job matched their skills and qualifications, at 86 per cent in 2021 and 89 per cent in 2022. In addition, women were less likely than men to have a job that matched their skills and qualifications (74 per cent of men in both years, 62 per cent of women in 2021 and 66 per cent of women in 2022). In both years, migrants working in 'accommodation/ food services' (38 per cent in 2021, 31 per cent in 2022) and 'agriculture, forestry and fishing' (43 per cent in 2021, 33 per cent in 2022) were the most likely to report that their job did not match their skills and qualifications, and in 2022 this also included migrants working in the 'wholesale/retail trade' industry (35 per cent in 2022).

Most migrant workers receive their minimum employment entitlements and have good working conditions, but some groups are more vulnerable in their jobs

Minimum rights and responsibilities set out in law apply to all employees, including migrant workers

Under New Zealand law, the adult minimum wage was \$20.00 from April 2021, and \$21.20 from April 2022. Employers are also required to provide workers with a written employment agreement, four weeks paid annual holidays per year, and ten days' paid sick leave per annum after six months of continuous employment. Further information about these and other basic employment entitlements is listed on the MBIE's 'Employment New Zealand' website⁹.

About a quarter of migrant employees feel they don't understand their employment rights well

About a quarter of migrant employees felt they didn't understand their employment rights well – 'not that well' or 'not at all well' – (25 per cent in 2021 and 23 per cent in 2022), with a higher proportion of women than men reporting this in both years (28 per cent of women in 2021 and 25 per cent of women in 2022, 22 per cent of men in 2021 and 21 per cent of men in 2022).

Migrants in the 'education and training' industry were more likely to report that they did not understand their employment rights well than the overall average for all migrant workers at 33 per cent in 2021 and 34 per cent in 2022. This 2022 result for 'education and training' was significantly higher than almost all other major industry groups.

Filipino workers, men, and those with lower qualification levels and English language proficiency were more likely to have had their entitlements withheld

In 2021, seven per cent of migrant workers reported that their employer had withheld, or said they would withhold, entitlements such as holiday pay or sick leave. This proportion reduced slightly in 2022 to five per cent.

Migrant employees from the Philippines more commonly reported that their employer had withheld, or said they would withhold, entitlements compared with all migrant workers. In 2021, 21 per cent of Filipino migrant workers reported that that their entitlements were withheld/their employer had threatened to withhold entitlements. However, in 2022 this proportion had reduced to 12 per cent of Filipino migrant workers.

In both years, migrant workers in 'construction' (sixteen per cent in 2021 and ten per cent in 2022), 'agriculture, forestry and fishing' (thirteen per cent in 2021 and eight per cent in 2022), and 'manufacturing' (thirteen per cent in 2021 and seven per cent in 2022) were the most likely to report that their employer had withheld/threatened to withhold entitlements. Men were also more likely to have experienced this breach of their rights than women, at nine per cent of men compared to five per cent of women in 2021, and six per cent of men and three per cent of women in 2022. As men were more likely to work in labour intensive industries, this trend may be industry rather than gender-related.



The occupational groups most likely to have their entitlements withheld or have had their employer threaten to withhold entitlements were 'technicians/trade workers' (fourteen per cent in 2021 and ten per cent in 2022), 'machinery operators/drivers' (seventeen per cent in 2021 and nine per cent in 2022), and labourers (thirteen per cent in 2021) and twelve per cent in 2022). Migrant employees who were among the least likely to report that their employer had withheld or threatened to withhold entitlements were those who worked in 'professional' occupations (two per cent each year), as 'clerical and administration workers' (three per cent in 2021) and two per cent in 2021), and as 'managers' in 2021 (four per cent).

In 2021, migrant workers on temporary visas were more likely to report that their employer had withheld or threatened to withhold entitlements (nine per cent) than migrants who were resident visa holders (three per cent). In 2022, there was no significant difference between the two groups. However, the makeup of the 2022 Resident Visa cohort was probably more similar to the 2021 work visa cohort due to the large number of work visa holders becoming residents under the one-off 2021 Resident Visa pathway.

Both years, those with a Bachelor's degree or higher were less likely to have their entitlements held back (six per cent in 2021 and four per cent in 2022) compared to those without a Bachelor's degree (nine per cent in 2021 and seven per cent in 2022). This demonstrates an improvement for both groups from 2021 to 2022, but the disparity between those with and without a degree has remained.

In 2021, migrant workers with lower levels of English language proficiency were more likely to report that their employer had withheld or threatened to withhold entitlements than those with higher levels of English proficiency. This difference was not observed in 2022. Only seven per cent of migrants who spoke English 'very well' or 'well' reported that their entitlements had been withheld/their employer had threatened to withhold entitlements compared to twelve per cent of those who spoke English 'neither well nor not well' and thirteen per cent who spoke English 'not very well/not at all well'.

Being paid less than the minimum wage was more common for those without a university qualification, Pacific or Filippino migrants, and manual or machine labourers

Three per cent of migrant workers reported that they were being paid less than the adult minimum wage in 2021 and this was similar in 2022, at two per cent, while ninety-three per cent of migrant employees were being paid at least the legal adult minimum wage in their current main job.

For both years, the occupations with the highest proportions of migrant workers being paid less than minimum wage were 'machinery operators/drivers' (six per cent in 2021 and five per cent in 2022) and 'labourers' (six per cent in 2021 and seven per cent in 2022). Migrant employees who were the least likely to be paid less than the minimum wage worked in 'professional' occupations (one per cent for both years), 'clerical and administration' in 2022 (less than one per cent), and as 'managers' in 2022 (one per cent). Despite the occupational variations in this result, there were no clear statistically significant differences by industry for either year.

Migrant workers from the Pacific Islands and the Philippines were over-represented among those who reported that they were being paid below minimum wage, in both survey years. In 2021, seven per cent of Pacific and five per cent of Filipino migrant employees were being paid less than minimum wage. The most common nationalities were similar in 2022, with four per cent of Pacific and seven per cent of Filipino migrants being paid less than the minimum wage.

While the overall proportion of migrant workers being paid less than the minimum wage was low, this proportion was lowest for those with a Bachelor's degree or higher (two per cent in 2021, one per cent in 2022), compared to those without a Bachelor's degree (four per cent each year).

Migrants on temporary work visas were more likely to have been asked/expected to pay to get or keep their job, as were Filipino and Indian migrants

In both years, four per cent of migrant workers had been asked or expected to pay their employer to get or keep their job. The small proportion who had been asked/expected to pay to get or keep their job were more likely to be working as 'machinery operators and drivers' (eleven per cent in 2021 and seven per cent in 2022), 'technicians and trade workers' (eight per cent in 2021 and six per cent in 2022), and 'labourers' in 2022 (seven per cent).

In both years, temporary migrants were more likely to report that they had been asked/expected to pay to get or keep their job (five per cent both years) than resident visa holders (three per cent both years).

Again, in both years, those whose highest qualification was below a Bachelor's degree were significantly more likely to be asked/expected by their employer to pay to get or keep their job (six per cent in 2021 and five per cent in 2022) than those with a Bachelor's degree or higher (four per cent in 2021 and three per cent in 2022).

Migrants from the Philippines (seven per cent in both years) and India (five per cent in both years) were also more likely to have been asked/expected to pay to get or keep their job.

Migrants with low levels of English proficiency were less likely to have written employment agreements

In both years, most migrant employees reported having written employment agreements for their main job (97 per cent in 2021, 98 per cent in 2022). Only two per cent of migrant workers in 2021 and one per cent in 2022 did not have a written employment agreement.


Migrants who spoke English 'not very well' or 'not at all well' were less likely to have written employment agreements (seven per cent without an agreement in 2021 and five per cent in 2022) than those who could speak English 'well' or 'very well' (one per cent in both years).

In 2021, the occupation with the highest proportion of migrant workers without a written employment agreement was 'community and personal service workers' (four per cent) while in 2022 this was 'other' occupations (four per cent) and 'labourers' (three per cent).

In 2021, Chinese migrants were the least likely group by nationality to have written employment agreements (four per cent). In contrast to some of the other findings from this analysis, in 2021, migrant employees from the Philippines were among those most likely to have a written employment agreement with only one per cent of Filipino migrants reporting not having agreements.

Chinese migrant employees also had the lowest self-reported ability with conversational English (with only 58 per cent speaking English at least 'well' in 2021 and 53 per cent in 2022) compared with all other nationalities (where between 94 per cent and 100 per cent each year reported speaking English at least 'well'). This may indicate that English language proficiency is one of the stronger indicators of whether a migrant worker has a written agreement rather than nationality. Although it is a legal requirement to provide a written employment agreement to every employee, the results suggest that employers may be overlooking this more often when they suspect the employee may not have the English language competency to read it. In 2022, no particular nationality group was more likely to have written employment agreements.

Figure 5: Prevalence of having a written employment agreement by English conversational ability, 2021



More than half of migrant workers felt they had been treated unfairly because they came from overseas, and many of these experiences were related to employment

Over half of all migrant employees reported that they had been treated unfairly since coming to New Zealand because they came from overseas on one or more occasions (57 per cent in 2021 and 58 of in 2022). Of those who were treated unfairly, 29 per cent experienced this while working with external clients or customers in each survey year, 31 per cent in 2021 and 28 per cent in 2022 experienced this when applying for a job, and 34 per cent in 2021 and 37 per cent in 2022 were treated unfairly when they were working with a manager or supervisor.

Of those who were treated unfairly, 'sales workers' most commonly experienced this while dealing with a client or customer (49 per cent in 2021, 44 per cent in 2022). 'Managers' (37 per cent in 2021, 34 per cent in 2022) and 'community and personal service workers' (36 per cent in 2021, 34 per cent in 2022) also experienced unfair treatment from clients and customers at higher rates than those in other common occupations.

'Labourers' (40 per cent in 2021, 46 per cent in 2022) were more likely to experience unfair treatment from their manager, supervisor, or work colleagues. This type of unfair treatment was also prevalent for 'technicians and trades workers' (42 per cent in 2021, 44 per cent in 2022), 'machinery operators and drivers' (43 per cent in 2021, 54 per cent in 2022), and 'community and personal service workers' in 2021 (40 per cent).

'Labourers' were less likely to receive information/support on health and safety at work than those in 'professional' occupations

Three-quarters of migrant employees were provided with information or support from their employer on health and safety at work. Support or information 'welcoming you to the workplace' was the second most common type of support provided in both years, followed by information or support on 'your employment rights and obligations'. About 40 per cent each year did not receive information on their employment rights and obligations. See Table 3 below for the breakdown of these results by year.

Across the occupational groups, at least 70 per cent of migrants received information or support about health and safety at work. Both years, the reported prevalence of this was slightly lower for 'labourers' (72 per cent in 2021, 70 per cent in 2022) than for migrant workers in several other more sedentary occupations, despite this being an occupation with physical injury risk.

Those in 'professional' (80 per cent in 2021, 79 per cent in 2022), 'clerical and administration' (77 per cent in 2021, 75 per cent in 2022) and 'manager' in 2022 (75 per cent) occupations were among the most likely to be provided with information or support from their employer welcoming them to the workplace.

'Technicians and trades workers' (30 per cent in 2021, 45 per cent in 2022), 'sales workers' in 2022 (50 per cent) and 'labourers' (24 per cent in 2021, 41 per cent in 2022) were among the least likely occupations to receive support and information from their employers about joining KiwiSaver, and 'technicians and trades workers' were also significantly less likely to have received information about joining a union than those in other occupations (at 12 per cent in 2021 and 13 per cent in 2022). This is similar to the proportion of managers getting information or support about joining a union (11 per cent in 2021, 13 per cent in 2022), despite managers being less likely to be eligible to join unions than workers in lower skilled jobs.

In 2022, employees were also asked if they had been provided with information or support on bullying and unfair treatment at work. Again, this support was less commonly received by those working as 'technicians and trades workers' (29 per cent), 'labourers' (30 per cent), 'machinery operators and drivers' (33 per cent) and those working as 'sales workers' (35 per cent).

Women were more likely than men to receive information from their employer about 'KiwiSaver' (46 per cent of women and 39 per cent of men in 2021, 58 per cent of women and 54 per cent of men in 2022). The increase in information provided about 'KiwiSaver' in 2022 may reflect the higher number of permanent migrants in the survey population in 2022 due to the introduction of the one-off 2021 Resident Visa scheme.

Men were more likely than women to receive information 'supporting you or your family to settle in New Zealand' (30 per cent of men, 18 per cent of women in 2021, 28 per cent of men, 19 per cent of women in 2022) and on 'New Zealand work styles and communicating in the New Zealand workplace' (42 per cent of men, 36 per cent of women in 2021, 41 per cent of men, 34 per cent of women in 2022). In 2022, a higher proportion of male than female employees were offered information or support with 'improving your English language skills' (17 per cent of men, 13 per cent of women), and with 'supporting you or your family to settle in New Zealand' (28 per cent of men, 19 per cent of women), and on 'New Zealand work styles and communicating in the New Zealand workplace' (41 per cent of men, 34 per cent of women). Women, however, were more likely than men to receive information on 'joining a union' (24 per cent of women and 17 per cent of men in 2021, 30 per cent of women and 20 per cent of men in 2022).

Survey results inform work to prevent migrant exploitation

Results from the Migrant Survey are an integral part of MBIE's programme of work to prevent migrant worker exploitation. The Migrant Survey enables MBIE and other government agencies to identify areas of vulnerability in migrant working environments and develop programmes to evaluate government policies and procedure.

The 2021 and 2022 Migrant Survey analysis on this topic reveals that, although uncommon, there are still breaches to migrants' basic employment rights and entitlements within the industries and occupations most commonly employing migrant men, towards migrants from specific countries such as the Philippines, and for migrants who have lower English language proficiency and education, among other groups.

MBIE will continue to monitor migrant experiences in the workplace through the annual Migrant Survey and evaluation of the updated Temporary Migrant Worker Exploitation prevention measures (which have been in place since July 2021).
