Submission in response to the NZ Government ten-year plan for oil and minerals From: Lawrence John Carter I am a member of the National Committee of Engineers for Social Responsibility Inc. (ESR). As part of my contribution to ESR I have assisted with the publication of 20 peer-reviewed papers on various aspects of climate change. These can be found on the ESR website www.esr.org.nz. I wrote Paper 17, which deals with sea-level rise and its likely impact. I am a retired professional engineer and academic staff member of the University of Auckland. In order to provide a viable planet for our descendants, we need to keep global warming to a limit of 1.5°C above the pre-industrial level. This means that we have to reduce our carbon emissions very significantly over the next ten years or so. This will not be easy since our economy relies heavily on the burning of fossil fuels such as oil, coal and gas. However, as a matter of survival it is necessary to make this change, and most of the 'reserves' of fossil fuels must be left in the ground. These principles lead to some policy points. First, there should be no new exploration for oil or gas, either on land or under the sea. Existing explorations should be curtailed as soon as possible. Second, those employees affected by these changes must be supported as they transition to new, sustainable employment. Third, an economy needs to be developed that relies on recycling (of minerals, etc.) first, and moves to extraction as a last resort. I understand fully that it's easy to say these things, and perhaps very difficult to do them, but for our continued survival we need to move in this direction. As a first step, Engineers for Social Responsibility is helping to organise a 'Convergence' in November, during which engineers will explore ways to make substantial reductions in carbon emissions in their businesses.
