5. Policy update

5.1 PGF Limited

In the next week you will receive a draft Cabinet paper and cover briefing to approve and circulate for Ministerial consultation. The draft Cabinet paper relates to two Orders in Council to add PGF Limited to Schedule 4A of the Public Finance Act 1989 and Schedule 35 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

These Orders in Council will establish PGF Limited as a Schedule 4A company and lists PGF Limited as a public purpose Crown-controlled company which in effect provides PGF Limited with an income tax exemption. Subject to approval, and Ministerial consultation, we will prepare the Cabinet paper for the Cabinet Legislation Committee meeting on 17 September 2019. We are currently consulting with relevant agencies on the draft Cabinet paper.


