#### **Opotiki Harbour Development update**

The Opotiki Harbour development project is nearing the end of the design and tender stage. This outlines the best construction types for the infrastructure and likely costs. At the same time, the working group, led by Opotiki Disrict Council are making the final inputs to the detailed business case, including:

- Economic modelling
- Staging of the aquaculture developments
- Negotiating user charges with Whakatohea Opotiki Mussels limited
- Agreeing the key risks, and
- Finalising the KPI status report.

The detailed business case will be provided along with the Cabinet Paper in early December

Taranaki team talks shop with central government agencies

Members of the 'Tapaue Roa – Make Way for Taranaki' Lead Team made their way to Wellington last Monday to present on 8 action areas of its action plan. The action areas aim to help further grow economic development within the Taranaki region. A good mix of central government agencies were in attendance to listen, and give feedback on, action areas including the Visitor Sector, Future Foods, Energy Futures, Skills and Talent, Maori Economy, Liveability and Vibrancy, Investment, and Connectivity and Accessibility.

MBIE continues to work alongside the Taranaki Lead Team to help finalise the action plan, with a launch of the action plan estimated for the end of February 2018.

A draft Cabinet Paper and Briefing seeking endorsement of the action plan and central government investment towards key actions is expected to be with the Minister in December 2017.

#### Manea footprints of Kupe

Waitangi Museum

The Manea project has been developed by the Te Hua o te Kawariki Trust (the Trust) to establish a Heritage Centre as a Tourism attraction in Opononi. This project is part of the visitor sector work stream of the Tai Tokerau Northland Economic Action Plan.

The Trust recently requested, and were approved, investment of up to \$50,000 from the Regional Growth Programmes, Senior Regional Official appropriation to support the final preparation of the project's business case to an "investment ready" state.

As a condition of receiving this investment, the Trust is required to secure non-central government investment to the same level. It has been confirmed by the local Economic Development Agency that the Trust was successful in its application to the Northland Regional Council on further investment of Comme towards this project. The Trust is awaiting confirmation from Far North Holding Limited on the final Comme investment application.

The Trust will now be able to finalise its business case in its bid to secure the **Scorperciprequired** for the development of the Heritage Centre.

Te Tau Ihu stakeholders meeting with MBIE Officials

Top of the South stakeholders from Marlborough District Council and the Nelson Regional Development Agency met with MBIE officials on Friday 17th to discuss the approach to economic development in this region. Further consultation with iwi and industry leaders in partnership with MBIE and MPI will take place. The region is keen to invite the Minister to visit and learn more about the region's aspirations and visit some enterprising industries and businesses.
