# 2. PROVINCIAL GROWTH FUND PROGRESS UPDATES

### 2.1 Provincial Growth Fund Weekly Update

Robert Pigou Privacy of natural

As at 23 May 2018, 197 projects had been logged in RipeDrive. This is an increase of 17 from last week. Of the 197 projects, 91 are Expressions of Interest (EoIs) and 106 are applications.

# 3. PROVINCIAL DEVELOPMENT UNIT UPDATES

### 3.1 June Cabinet Paper

AJ Millward Privacy of natural

The Provincial Development Unit (PDU) is preparing a Cabinet paper, which at this stage is scheduled to go to the Cabinet Economic Development Committee on 20 June. We have discussed the scope of the paper with the Minister's office, and have prepared a short note for the Regional Economic Development Delegated Ministers meeting on 29 May. The paper will report progress on and seek decisions relating to some areas of further work identified in the February Cabinet paper (e.g. regional indicators, an evaluation plan). In particular, it may seek decisions about the release of the Investment Statement and options for the government holding equity stakes in some investments. It will also seek decisions on a number of policy and operational matters that will improve the implementation of the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF), including giving some decision rights to the Head of the PDU.

### 3.2 Economic Development, Science and Innovation Select Committee Hearing

The Minister has been invited to appear before the Economic Development, Science and Innovation Committee in his capacity as Minister for Regional Economic Development and Minister of Infrastructure. The hearing is scheduled for Thursday 7 June from 11.30am until 1.00pm. PDU and Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) staff are preparing information to support the Minister at this hearing and will also attend. A preparation session is scheduled with the Minister on Monday 28 May.

### 3.3 Engagement Strategy

The PDU is developing a stakeholder engagement strategy to promote the PGF to regions, sectors and commercial investors. We hope to discuss the high level framework for this strategy with you soon. The PDU will then work with your office and regional stakeholders to develop a detailed pro-active and coordinated engagement plan for you, the Under-Secretary, the Independent Advisory Panel and the PDU leadership team.

### 3.4 PDU contribution to MBIE views on the New Zealand Productivity Commission - Lowemissions economy: Draft report

The PDU was asked to contribute to a whole of MBIE briefing on the Ministry's view on the New Zealand Productivity Commission's draft Low-emissions economy report. We outlined the parts of the report that are related to the PGF, and our work underway which complements their draft recommendations.

The report found that innovation in clean technologies, expanding horticulture to replace meat and dairy, and increasing forestry were important in order to transition New Zealand to a low emission economy. We identified that the PGF has invested in a feasibility study for 'H2 Taranaki Hydrogen Road Map' to help the region transition its economy to renewable energy production. Investments in future foods feasibility studies in Taranaki, the One Billion Trees programme and regional rail projects are also examples of PGF funding supporting projects which will assist in the just transition to a low emissions economy.

### 3.5 June 2018 In Principle Expense Transfer (IPET) Submission

The Minister for Regional Economic Development is required to approve an In Principle Expense Transfer from the Regional Economic Development appropriation for which you are responsible, to be included in the June 2018 submission for Vote Business, Science and Innovation (BSI). A briefing was submitted to your office on 24 May 2018 seeking your approval of up to <sup>Contential advector</sup> to ensure all unspent funding is carried forward. On 5 June 2018, Hon David Parker as the Minister responsible for Vote BSI will provide a written submission to the Minister of Finance that will comprise of the consolidated IPET proposals. The final amount of the proposed transfer for Regional Economic Development will be confirmed through the 2018 October Baseline Update process.

## 4. INFORMATION ON UPCOMING PROVINCIAL GROWTH FUND PROPOSALS

### 4.1 28th Māori Battalion

The Waitangi National Trust Board continues to undertake consultation with the representatives of A, B, C and D Companies along with the support of <sup>Privacy of natural persons</sup> and <sup>Privacy of natural persons</sup> They are meeting with the D Company representatives in Wellington on Saturday 26 May and possibly at another Hui in the South Island.

On 21 May, the Senior Regional Officials (SROs) approved \$297,000 for further design work for the museum on the condition that a central government representative joins the museum project control group to oversee and support the procurement process.

The final business case for the museum will be signed off by the Waitangi National Trust Board at their meeting on 15 June. A full application for the PGF for the museum is expected to be ready for PGF Ministers to consider on 2 July.

#### 4.2 Wairoa

The PDU is working closely with Wairoa District Council (WDC) on a range of projects. summary:

Youth Employment Support Programme (Job Shop), the contract for \$150,000 has been signed by PDU and is with the WDC for their signature. The first payment will be made or receipt of an invoice from the Council.

PDU staff spent the day on 24 May working with the Council team on the \$250,000 Capability Support proposal. PDU is completing the application in consultation with Kitea Tipuna (WDC). The funding will be associated with key economic development themes emerging from today's workshop. These include extracting economic potential from the region's natural assets (river and land) and infrastructure (rail). The application will be ready for assessment by the PDU Investment team by mid next week.

The New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) is completing their strategic business case for improvements to Confidential information entrusted to the Government. The PDD are working closely with NZTA to progress this work and to identify any opportunities to support the project.

On 21 May, SROs considered the proposal for the Confidential information entrusted to the Government . The proposal was declined as there was not a clear commercial case for the investment, in particular how it would lift productivity, create jobs and attract commercial activities. The Mayor of Wairoa has advised that he will write to the PDU to seek a review of that decision and to understand what they need to do to improve the proposal.

#### 4.3 Chatham Islands

On Tuesday 22 May PDU received a letter signed by Alfred Preece (Mayor Chatham Islands Council), Phil Seymour (Chair Chatham Island Enterprise Trust) Maui Solomon (Chair Hoktehi Moriori Trust) and John Kamo (Chair Ngati Mutunga) confirming their willingness to work together to achieve better outcomes for the Chatham Islands. The Chatham Islands leaders have identified the three key priorities as:

- Airport extension; 1)
- Confidential information 2) ; and
- entrusted to the Government , and Confidential information entrusted to the Government 3)

PDU staff will meet with the Mayor and three Chairs next week in the Chatham Islands to discuss the PGF and details of the projects that they would likely submit for consideration.

#### Kaikoura/Blenheim Visit 4.4

On 17-18 May, staff from MBIE and NZTA had a series of meetings with stakeholders about two cycle trails; one from Christchurch to Waipara, and the other from Kaikoura to Picton (previously referred to as the Coastal Pacific Cycle trail). Stakeholders met with the

following: Kaikōura District Council, Marlborough District Council, Enterprise North Canterbury, Waimakariri District Council, Environment Canterbury, Hurunui Trails Trust and the Marlborough Kaikōura Trail Trust.

Both of these trails will likely submit proposals seeking feasibility funding from the PGF for the trails. Additional and complimentary cycle trails in the Top of the South are also in early stages of development. PDU staff will support applicants through this process and keep you updated.

### 4.5 Milford Connectivity

John Doorbar Privacy of natural persons



On the 7-8 May, meetings were held between MBIE and local stakeholders (NZTA, Dewners, NZ Police, St John's Ambulance, Department of Conservation, Southland District Council and Milford Sound Tourism) that are proposing a 120km fibre optic link between Te Anau and Milford Sound along SH94. The link will benefit tourism, road safety, environmental and geological monitoring and communities along the route. It is anticipated the proposal will become a PGF application led by the Southland District Council. MBIE will follow progress and update you on any developments. Note the Minister of Broadcasting, Communications and Digital Media has also been updated.
