Wairoa District Council is being supported by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) with strategic planning and Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) process guidance. A third planning workshop is scheduled for 26 June 2018.	The application will be presented for SRO decision 28 June 2018.
An application for Capability Support (\$250K) has been submitted. The funding being sought is for the provision of capability support for Wairoa District Council's project office. It will also be used to conduct studies that identify economic development opportunities, and to prepare subsequent PGF applications.	EASEL

Te Tau Ihu (Top of the South)	
Comment:	Next Steps:
The Mayors from Nelson, Tasman and Marlborough, iwi and Wakatu Incorporated agreed to develop the Te Tay ihu 2077 – Regional Growth Strategy. The long term strategy will identify strengths and weaknesses of the region and prioritise their regional economic development opportunities. An initial Steering Group potentially comprising all eight iwi, the three Councils and business representatives with Wakatu Incorporation as one of the business representatives will be formed. Further hui will be held to confirm the governance and management going forward. 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Southern Waikato Economic Action Plan

Comment:

Work on the Southern Waikato Economic Action Plan is underway. Three district workshops have been held to date, in Te Kuiti, Otorohanga and Tokoroa, each attracting around 40-50 participants. Attendees have been primarily from the business sector, with representatives of local iwi (Maniapoto and Ruakawa) also in attendance. Further workshops with iwi, as well as one-on-one interviews with key stakeholders across the three districts, will continue into July. Early indications are that there are opportunities in sectors such as forestry, agriculture and tourism, as well as in cross-cutting areas such as youth employment and improving perceptions of the South Waikato area.

New Waikato Economic Development Agency

Comment:

A new Waikato Regional Economic Development Agency (REDA) will be operational from 1 July 2018. The agency's objectives will be to lift economic performance across the whole Waikato region, attract and grow new business investment and taient, and be 'one voice' for economic development in the region. The REDA will be based at the Waikato Innovation Park (WIP), with current WIP Chief Executive Stuart Gordon as the REDA's Establishment Chief Executive. The REDA will absorb Waikato Means Business, the 20-year economic development strategy created with input from regional business leaders, as well as Waikato Innovation Park's business development functions.

The first major task for the REDA is the organisation of a Waikato Economic Summit on 30 & 31 August, which will bring together business, iwi and Māori, local government, central government and philanthropic leaders to agree on the region's economic priorities and potential PGF proposals. You will be invited to attend.

Further stakeholder engagement will take place into July with a report on economic opportunities in the subregion scheduled to be completed by September. The final Action Plan is due in early 2019 and is likely to lead to proposals for PGF funding.

PipeDrive Update

Comment:

PipeDrive has been updated this week. The PDU has added two new pipelines, one to store 'on hold' and 'withdrawn' projects called Inactive Projects Pipeline, and one to track projects through the contracting phase post SRO and RED Ministers' decisions called PGF Legal Contracting. This has provided a change in the total figures for this week's update as our numbers now capture the 'on hold' and 'withdrawn' projects.

As at 18 June 2018, 240 projects have been lodged in PipeDrive. 21 projects are new this week. Of the 240 projects, 119 are Expressions of Interest (EoIs) and 121 are applications. 5 projects are on hold.
