Commentary:	The panel noted the DEV report.  Robert Pigou provided the following update:  A briefing is going to Ministers requesting further PDU delegations to manage applications that do not meet the PGF criteria.  Commercial Information  The number of aged contracts in the system continues to trend down and remains a key focus for the PDU.  Further work is being undertaken on contract variations/waivers which are occurring due to milestones not being met. PDU are providing assistant to contracted parties.  Processes at PDU continue to be refined with the appointment of a Chief Operating Officer who has overall operational oversight of the PDU work. This appointment reflects the change in focus to project management and delivery; and client management.  Commercial Information
QQ.	A PGF Limited briefing is being provided to the two shareholding Ministers. Intention is to have the company registered and operational by mid-September 2019.  The panel discussed relaxing the conditions on contracts versus the potential risks this could expose. The panel agreed that in shaping their advice for the Ministers, the panel would remain consistent and rigorous on loan conditions.



Commentary:	<ul> <li>The panel recommends the approval of the full amount of the loan sought by the applicant of \$12.1m. As part of this recommendation the panel recommends that:</li> <li>both phases of the project are written within one single contract, subject to the conditions recommended by PDU; and</li> <li>phase two only be released upon successful operation of phase one to the satisfaction of the PDU.</li> <li>The panel unanimously supports the project and agrees it has the potential to deliver a leading edge transformational wood product and, if this technology proves to be successful, it will offer the opportunity to unlock value in many other remote forests in the regions.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The project is also well aligned with key PGF criteria, particularly:         <ul> <li>increasing FTEs from commercial information</li> </ul> </li> <li>accelerating this project will have economic, employment and social benefits to the Tairāwhiti community; and</li> <li>strong alignment with the Tairāwhiti Economic Action Plan and strong regional support.</li> </ul>
