Background & context:

Proposal:

 Develop a comprehensive Tourism and Trails Strategy that includes a Destination Development Plan and Cycle / Walk / Horse Trail Strategy for the Tararua District.

Funding Sought:

- PGF Funding \$60,000

Background:

- a) The district does not currently have a comprehensive trails strategy and this has resulted in ad hoc trail development by community groups that often ends up being transferred to TDC when maintenance becomes necessary.
- b) A key part of the wider project is the development of a trails strategy to both help attract new visitors to Tararua and provide recreation / travel to work opportunities to residents.
- c) The announcement of a new state highway from Manawatu through to Woodville has created enormous economic opportunities for associated trails, both on the new route and around the old Manawatu Gorge access points.

Recommendation:

We recommend that the SROs:

a) Note Tourism is one of the nine opportunities
identified as focus areas within the Manawatu
Whanganui Economic Action Plan (Accelerate 25).

- **b)** Note DOC is very supportive of TDC's efforts to provide safe recreational opportunities.
- c) Note TPK support the proposal and flag the potential for this to make a positive contribution to the regional Māori economy.
- d) Note NZTA has not been involved in this project and it is not in the Horizons Regional Transport Plan. NZTA has indicated a keenness to work with TDC on its strategy.
- e) Note The project falls outside of the "Great Ride" status and does not qualify for MBIE Cycleways funding.
- f) Support the recommendation to Approve \$60,000 from the PGF fund towards the District Tourism and Trails Strategy including District and Urban Walkways / Cycleways Project subject to:
 - Agreement between the PDU and TDC as to the project deliverables, and associated detailed budget;
 - ii) PDU agreement to the make-up of the Stakeholder Advisory Group and

d) TDC's strategy is to diversify their visitor markets and develop events and attractions that bring people into the district rather than rely solely on passing traffic. proposed project management structure, including the risk management approach; and

iii) PDU agreement of the consultant/consultant firm contracted to undertake the work.
