Background & context:

Proposal:

 Build an indigenous visitor experience based on the Ngāti Rangi narrative pertaining to the Battle of Ohaeawai and key local identities of the time.

Funding Sought:

- PGF Funding: \$0.1 million

Background:

- The Centre wll include a gallery display cases allowing visitors to get up close to precious 3D copies of 12 Māori artefacts gifted to the Huntarian Museum in 1864.
- This is a two part project a feasibility study and capability development.
- Feasibility study (\$100k) will review key opportunities, design development plan and produce a project plan.
- Capability development (\$\sigma^{\text{commercial Information}}\)) will focus on building capability in tourism, digital and business development.
- The applicant has asked for \$\text{commercial Information}\$
 however, after assessing the EOI, PDU
 thinks that at this stage PGF should only
 fund \$100k for the feasibility study.

- a) Discuss Chaeawai Visitors Centre EOI
- Note The project is focussed on a PGF priority sector (tourism) and is located in a surge region (Northland)
- c) Note The applicant has requested \$\(^{\text{Commercial Info}}\) for a feasibility study and capability development but at this stage PDU recommends to fund the feasibility study and later submit an application for capability development
- d) Note The feasibility study will inform the decision on the amount of money required for the capability development
- e) Support the recommendation to Approve \$100,000 from the PGF fund towards feasibility study for the Ohaeawai Visitors Centre subject to:
 - a. PDU due diligence on any business contracted to this project

Risks Issues:

 The proposed project is in close proximity to other cultural centres and will be competing for the same tourist dollar. It can be mitigated if tourism services can develop a package of tourism products for visitors.

Eligibility points of note:

- Due diligence:- Full due diligence is to be completed. It is a condition of approval that due
 diligence is to be to the satisfaction of the Head of PDU Investment team.
- Conflict(s) of interest:- Based on the information provided no conflict of interest is evident noting that full due diligence will inform this item further.
- Illegal Activity:- Based on the application information provided and feedback from other agencies there is no indication that the applicant or project has been involved in, or associated with illegal activity.
- Alignment with Regional development plans:- This proposal aligns with the Tai Tokerau Northland Growth Study and its allied Economic Action Plan.
- Commercial funding availability: Given the nature of the project which is to complete a feasibility study for a visitor centre, access to commercial funding is not considered a feasible option.
