Minimum Wage Review 2019

Portfolio

Workplace Relations and Safety

On 11 December 2019, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee)

- noted that the Coalition Agreement between the New Zealand Labour Party and New Zealand First includes the goal to increase the adult minimum wage to \$20 by 2021;
- agreed that the adult minimum wage be increased from \$17.70 per hour to \$18.90 per hour from 1 April 2020;
- agreed to maintain the starting-out and training minimum wages at 80 percent of the adult minimum wage, which will mean that these each increase to \$15.12 per hour from 1 April 2020;
- 4 **invited** the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to the above paragraphs through an Order in Council;
- 5 **noted** that these changes to the minimum wages will be announced before the end of 2019.
