

## **Dunedin/Otago Package Overview**

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of this cover note is to provide an overview of the Dunedin/Otago package that is due to be announced in September/October. This will provide context prior to Regional Economic Development Ministers' (RED Ministers) consideration of Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) applications; KiwiRail Dunedin Hillside Workshops and Commercial Information.

#### **Background**

#### **Rationale for Package**

One of the key sectors identified by the Provincial Development Unit (PDU) for Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) investment is the Engineering/Manufacturing sector, with a particular focus on Otago and Southland regions. RED Ministers considered this as part of the Sector Investment Briefing [3942 18-19 refers] at the RED Ministers meeting 26 June 2019.

These are to be announced in late September/October along with other Dunedin projects such as the Centre of Digital Excellence and possibly the Dunedin Waterfront project.

Decisions for funding have gone through the agreed PGF decision making processes, including the two PGF applications for RED Ministers' consideration; KiwiRail Dunedin Hillside Workshops and Commercial Information

#### Approach taken by PDU for Engineering/Manufacturing proposals

The PDU has been working directly with KiwiRail on its proposal to upgrade the Hillside Workshop and with Commercial Information on an Commercial Information investment.

In addition, the PDU has been working with the Southland Otago Regional Engineering Collective (SOREC) on how the PGF can assist the sector to rebuild some of the capability and capacity it has lost in recent years. Two key issues were identified - the need for capital to invest in modern and more productive equipment; and the need for more workers, both skilled and unskilled.

Following the initial engagement with SOREC and a number of firms, which included testing several different types of interventions (including loans for equipment, grants based on number of workers employed, and grants for equipment), the Head of PDU agreed to officials working with individual firms to identify specific equipment a firm required that would increase the firm's productivity while also requiring new workers.

The PDU has visited each firm put forward for funding and discussed the firm's needs and opportunities. This has resulted in a package of proposals that covers 'enablers' at one end through to 'heavy engineering' at the other end.



## **Overall Package**

The overall package is shown in the table below; it includes two tranches of funding (Commercial Information) for small engineering firms, further details provided in Annex One. The below package does not include Commercial Information at this stage; Commercial Information

"Heavy Engineering" (\$19.9m)

# KiwiRail Dunedin Hillside Workshops

- 1. KiwiRail Holdings Limited (KiwiRail) has applied for PGF funding which proposes reestablishing Dunedin's Hillside Workshops as a mechanical hub and heavy-engineering facility. This facility will provide key infrastructure to service KiwiRail's current and future rolling stock and to help enable a more resilient and reliable rail network.
- 2. The present condition of Hillside, which is the South Island's only operational heavy-engineering Workshop, is noted by KiwiRail as a key vulnerability for the rail sector. KiwiRail notes that it is essential the Hillside Workshops are invested in to ensure a reliable and resilient rail network through maximised and timely servicing of rolling stock.
- 3. The current site is impaired by aged buildings, contamination and subsidence. The PGF investment will specifically be used towards demolition of end of life/unoccupied buildings, site decontamination and asbestos mitigation, workshop upgrades for buildings (Asset 1812 and 1813), and essential interior upgrades for Asset 1812.

#### **Background**

- 4. One of the key sectors identified by the PDU for Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) investment is the Engineering/Manufacturing sector. Otago and Southland were identified as two regions which possess a high number of firms in this sector. In June 2019, RED Ministers considered that the Engineering/Manufacturing sector would become a focus for the PGF, Sector Investment Briefing [3942 18-19 refers].
- 5. The PDU has been working with the Southland Otago Regional Engineering Collective (SOREC) on how the PGF can assist the engineering sector to rebuild some of the capability and capacity it has lost in recent years. Two key issues were identified the need for capital to invest in modern and more productive equipment; and the need for more workers, both

#### PDU recommendation

- 6. The PDU recommends that you approve KiwiRail Holdings Limited's Dunedin Hillside Workshops application for a \$19.97 million grant from the PGF.
- 7. The PDU has been working directly with KiwiRail and SOREC on the proposal to ungrade the Hillside Workshops on how the PGF can assist the sector to rebuild some of the capability and capacity it has lost in recent years.

#### **Benefits**

- 8. The key benefits of the proposal are the number of highly-skilled engineering jobs created; the increased capacity (from units able to be serviced at any one time); the reduction of lead times for servicing; and facility improvements increasing the productivity of staff.
- 9. The forecast revenue increase from the upgraded facility is an extra \$Commercial Information . This will be achieved by undertaking the following new work:
  - "" increase in wagon bogie refurbishment (currently undertaken in Lower Hutt)
  - Increase of weekly locomotive maintenance work from units
  - Reinstatement of paint booth (currently undertaken in Lower Hutt)
  - Increased wagon maintenance and conversion project work
- 10. In addition, KiwiRai has implemented a sustainable outcomes framework to formalise social, economic, community and environmental outcomes. In accordance with the framework the project procurement will look at each supplier's commitment to:
  - a) Trainee development with a focus on Māori, disadvantaged youth and long- term unemployed for apprentices and trades training
  - b) Employment of cadets, graduates and apprentices
  - c) Local supply
  - d) Sustainable environmental outcomes carbon reduction, recycling, EV/hybrid vehicles, carbon offsetting.
- 11. KiwiRail notes that within commercial information of project completion the site workforce will increase from to around employees. This will likely be a mixture of skilled labour including welding, fabrication, fitting, machine operators, electrical testing and diagnostics, shunting and vehicle refinishes. It will also include apprentices.
