		The project aligns with relevant regional economic frameworks as well as being one of four components in the Gore District Council Action Plan. The scoping project included consultation with 33 key stakeholders, which will continue as an ongoing stakeholder programme for a collaborative approach.			
		The Treasury noted that it considers some aspects of the proposal seem to duplicate services already on offer through government.			
		MSD is supportive of this approach, and notes that it cannot fund the proposal as the integrated approach is out of its scope. MSD funding focuses on direct employment outcomes, whereas this proposal has a more holistic approach, also focusing on wellbeing and resilience.
