Purpose

Remediation and upgrade of the Rotorua Museum

Project overview

Project overview

- 1. This briefing presents Regional Economic Development Delegated Ministers (RED Ministers) with the option to fund the remediation and upgrade of the Rotorua Museum. The application has been made by the Rotorua Lakes Council (RLC).
- 2. RLC has aspirations to develop the Government Gardens Cultural Quarter to become world class. Funding this project aligns well with the rest of investment in Rotorua, including the Lakefront Development and Whakarewarewa Forest. Investment in the area is supporting significant positive impact on social and economic outcomes, such as enabling locals to be employed into PGF projects.
- 3. While the Government Gardens Cultural Quarter application contains several projects, RLC has made it clear that the priority project is the remediation and upgrade of the Retorua Museum.

Benefits

- 4. Investment by the PGF will deliver several benefits:
 - a. Integrating the Museum with the Energy Events Centre and Sportsdrome to provide one of the largest conferencing and cultural centres in the Central North Island. This would provide a unique Cultural experience to business events that would attract higher value international events.
 - b. Attracting more events and attractions in the Cultural Quarter which connects the Lakefront and Whakarewarewa forest developments.
 - c. A more equitable community with higher yield tourism benefits triggering economic flow on effects that will improve the social situation for Rotorua, particularly Māori.

Funding sources

5. RLC is seeking a \$15 million grant from the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF)



- 6. RLC has also confirmed it will make a contribution of \$\(^{\text{commercial Information}}\) toward the project costs.

Construction

- 8. The RLC has flagged that there could be a potential risk in securing contractors to undertake the work, however, it has already instituted mitigation action by:
 - a. Planning to meet with various local contractors in August 2019 to bring them up to speed on the plans and to allow them to start thinking of the coming opportunities and timelines.
 - b. Commencing the development of the procurement plan in August 2019.
 - c. Undertaking Expression of Interest for construction of Stage 1 and 1a out to public market in September 2019 to understand what contractors may be interested.
 - d. Consideration for the remaining stages to be packaged up as a whole and as a design and build package
- The procurement for this project will be guided by the RLC's procurement manual and strict procurement guidelines.

Stakeholder support

10. The project has garnered significant support from Museums Aotearoa, Tourism Industry Aotearoa, the Tourism Export Council, the New Zealand Historic Places Trust, and local iwi.

Contingency for coalition agreement items

- 11. A contingency of \$\(^{\text{Commercial Information}}\) of PGF funding has been set aside for coalition agreement projects. Part of this contingency has already been utilised.
- 12. The Provincial Development Unit (PDU) notes that as part of the New Zealand Labour Party and New Zealand First Coalition Agreement, supporting NZ First's Racing Policy is identified as a Coalition Priority. The PDU understands that this proposal falls within that policy given the recommendations from the John Messara 'Review of the New Zealand Racing Industry'.
- 13. The Treasury notes that this contingency is also to include other projects, including a Centre of Digital Excellence (CODE) in Dunedin, and a Te Hiku Sports Hub.



Management and governance

14. RLC has robust governance processes in place to ensure probity and effectiveness in achieving the project and aligning to regional goals. RLC has proposed the following governance structure and reporting arrangements:



Next steps

- Subject to decisions by Ministers, the PDU will:
 - a. Finalise any further due diligence matters;
 - b. Prepare and negotiate the grant agreement documents.
 - c. Obtain confirmation of co-funding amounts;
 - d. Review and agree the selected contractors' terms and conditions to undertake the work;
 - e. Review the detailed project plan, governance, and project management structure; and
 - f. Obtain confirmation of project costs and payment schedule.
