

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		This project is an expansion of a service which has been successfully delivered for 7 years in South Auckland and Hamilton. As such, MPP have shown that they have strong project management and governance processes in place, which will be expanded in line with the expansion of the service. MSD, MoE and TEC have all been consulted on this initiative. They are all supportive of the intent of the project; however all of these agencies have identified that work will be required to ensure the service is embedded effectively into each region, in particular to ensure the service is complementary to other already services already available. Strong cross agency links will be required at a regional level to ensure success of the service.
