Gisborne Airport Terminal (Tairawhiti)	DEFER	Ministers raised that there is a wider, national problem facing regional airports that needs to be better understood. Ministers expressed the need for a set of principles for making decisions around funding airport infrastructure/a strategy for regional air connectivity before more investment decisions of this nature are taken. Officials noted MoT work is underway to develop principles and will be completed within a month. Ministers noted the time pressures that the applicant identifies, and questioned whether the proposed timeframes for delivery are feasible given that consenting has not been completed. Mt Titirangi – Puhi Kai Iti Connection (Tairawhiti)	APPROVE in principle Subject to further work to determine appropriate costings, and progress towards a bookable attraction in the region.	Ministers noted that this is part of a package of tourism initiatives to support the 2019 250 th anniversary of Cook's landing, and has been recommended for funding by officials. TSY concerns about costings for project were noted as well as some concerns about what the package comprises. Commercial Information
National Algae Research and Development Centre (Top of the South)	APPROVE with conditions	Ministers noted the importance of ensuring that the applicant is equipped with appropriate incentives and commercial expertise, given its commercial track record. Commercial Information
Predator Free 2050	DEFER	Ministers noted that this initiative cuts across a number of sectors, but it is difficult to understand how the investment creates sustainable benefits and so whether this is the best use of PGF funding. Notes commercial structure of company may be helpful in ensuring an enduring impact. Also noted that this was a potential example of 'Crown funding Crown', but that this does not detract from its merits. Commercial Information
