### Screen Industry Workers Bill: Approval for Introduction

**Portfolio** Workplace Relations and Safety

On 11 February 2020, the Cabinet Legislation Committee:

1. **noted** that the Screen Industry Workers Bill creates a new workplace relations regime for contractors working in the screen industry that will allow them to bargain collectively;
2. **approved** the Screen Industry Workers Bill [PCO 21870] for introduction, subject to the final approval of the government caucuses and sufficient support in the House of Representatives;
3. **agreed** that the Bill be introduced in February 2020;
4. **agreed** that the government propose that the Bill be:
  - 4.1. referred to the Education and Workforce Committee for consideration for a period of three months;
  - 4.2. Constitutional conventions
