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Fuel Industry Bill: Further Policy Decisions and Approval for Introduction

On 24 June 2020, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee (DEV)

Background

- noted that the Fuel Industry Bill (the Bill) will promote competition in fuel markets for the long term benefit of consumers, by providing for:
 - 1.1 a regime requiring fuel suppliers to publicly post the prices at which they will sell to wholesale customers at storage terminals;
 - 1.2 a regime governing contractual terms between wholesale suppliers and their wholesale customers (excluding commercial customers such as Fonterra);
 - 1.3 (requirements for display of information relating to the price of fuel at retail fuel sites;
 - requirements for fuel industry participants to collect and disclose certain information to enable monitoring of the fuel market and to ensure enough information is available to assess whether the purpose of the Act is being met;
 - 1.5 mediation and arbitration procedures for disputes in relation to the terminal gate pricing and wholesale contract provisions;
 - enforcement powers for the Commerce Commission, and civil pecuniary penalties based on those in the Commerce Act 1986;
- 2 **noted** that during the drafting of the Bill, a number of issues have arisen that require additional policy approvals or changes to current policy approvals;

Policy proposals

agreed that as part of the terminal gate pricing regime, wholesale suppliers must provide notice if forecast supply at a terminal is not sufficient to meet forecast demand in a prescribed time period and if the prescribed minimum has already been supplied in the prescribed time period;

- 4 4.1 **noted** that on 12 February 2020, DEV agreed that the Bill prescribe, in regulations, a list of terms that are likely to have an anti-competitive effect [DEV-20-MIN-0008, paragraph 11.6.1];
 - 4.2 **agreed to recommend** that Cabinet rescind the decision referred to in paragraph 4.1 above; and instead
 - 4.1 **agreed** that a list of terms that are likely to have an anti-competitive effect be prescribed in the Bill;
- 5 5.1 **noted** that on 12 February 2020, DEV agreed that the wholesale contractual terms regime come into effect, for existing contracts, on a date appointed by Order in Council, and no later than 24 months after the date of Royal Assent [DEV-20-MIN-0008, paragraph 13.2];
 - 5.2 **agreed to recommend** that Cabinet rescind the decision referred to in paragraph 5.1 above; and instead
 - agreed that the timeframe for implementation of provisions relating to termination of contracts once they have reached a prescribed maximum duration be the same for new and existing contracts, and that this timeframe be set on a date appointed by Order in Council and no later than 12 months after the date the Bill receives Royal Assent;
- agreed that the Commerce Commission be able to provide a notice for corrective action requiring a person who has not complied with a consumer information requirement to remedy the compliance or ensure that non-compliance is not continued or repeated;
- agreed to provide for civil pecuniary penalties for breaches of the requirement to comply with a notice for corrective action of \$10,000 for an individual and \$30,000 in any other case;
- 8 8.1 **noted** that on 12 February 2020, DEV agreed to include in the Bill provisions relating to information disclosure [DEV-20-MIN-0008, paragraph 21];
 - **agreed to recommend** that Cabinet rescind the decisions referred to in paragraph 8.1 above; and instead
 - agreed that the purposes of information disclosure be to enable monitoring of the performance of engine fuel markets and to ensure that sufficient information is readily available for the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment and the Commerce Commission to assess whether the purpose of the Act is being met;
- 9 9.1 **noted** that on 12 February 2020, DEV agreed to release a draft of the Bill for the purposes of targeted consultation with key stakeholders;
 - 9.2 **agreed to recommend** that Cabinet rescind the decision referred to in paragraph 9.1 above;

Financial implications

10 **noted** that on 12 February 2020, Cabinet noted that further consideration will be given to how best to fund the ongoing costs of implementing this regulatory regime;

Legislative implications

- noted that the Fuel Industry Bill holds a category 2 priority (to be passed in 2020) on the 2020 Legislation Programme;
- approved the Fuel Industry Bill for introduction [PCO 22620/6.0], subject to the final approval of the government caucus and sufficient support in the House of Representatives;
- agreed that the Bill be introduced on 29 June 2020;
- agreed that the government propose that the Bill be:
 - 15.1 referred to the Transport and Infrastructure Committee for consideration;
 - 15.2 enacted by July 2020.
