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### Background

- 1. In April 2018, Cabinet agreed that a tagged operating and capital expenditure contingency be set aside for Manifesto Commitments to the Regions, and these would be approved through the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) [CAB-18-MIN-0158.03 refers].
- The tagged contingency was established with \$<sup>Commercial Information</sup> (Operating \$<sup>Commercial Information</sup>) and in July 2019 an additional \$<sup>Commercial Information</sup> was added to the tagged operating contingency [CAB-19-MIN-0317 refers].
- 3. Cabinet has approved three draw downs from the fund since its establishment and this briefing is requesting a further draw down of \$<sup>Commercial Information</sup>.
- Cabinet Economic Development Committee also approved [DEV-19-MIN-03-8 refers) a transfer of \$5.000 million from the tagged contingency Manifesto Commitments to the Regions – Capital to the tagged contingency Manifesto Commitments to the Regions – Operating.
- 5. Table 1 summarises the status of the tagged contingency including the impact this request will have.



- 6. Cabinet Economic Development Committee confirmed in December [DEV-19-MIN-0338 refers] that the Regional Economic Development (RED) Ministers have authority to draw down the remaining tagged operating and capital expenditure contingency funding.
- 7. All projects that funding is being drawn down for have been approved by RED Ministers previously.
- 8. A brief description of the projects follows.

**Commercial Information**

Dunedin Centre of Digital Excellence \$10.095 million (Briefing 3985 18-19 refers)

- 15. The Labour Party Manifesto 2017 includes a commitment to invest \$10 million over 10 years to establish a Centre of Digital Excellence (CODE) in Dunedin, with the vision of a \$1 billion computer gaming industry in New Zealand.
- 16. An initial business case to outline how Dunedin City would deliver on the project was funded by the PGF in October 2018.
- 17. The business case established that the project presents an opportunity to have a complementary focus on Commercial Information and to establish a key point of difference for CODE.
- 18. In June 2019 based on the outcome of the business case RED ministers approved a further \$10 million for investment in CODE
- 19. In November 2019, RED Ministers approved a grant of \$0.095 million from the Manifesto Commitments to the Regions so the applicant could undertake a business case for the project.

Rotorua Government Gargens \$15.000 million (Briefing 3387 18-19 refers)

20. The Ro crua Lakes Council submitted an application to the PGF to develop the Government Gardens Cultural Quarter for the upgrade of the Rotorua Museum.

21. In June 2019 RED Ministers approve grant funding of \$15 million for this project to be funded from the tagged contingency Manifesto Commitments for the Regions – Operating.

Hawkes Bay Community Fitness Centre \$5.000 million (Briefing 1328 18-19 refers)

- 22. This proposal seeks funding to construct a 43-bed hostel with self-catering facilities and amenities. The applicant will also use funding to acquire portable fitness training equipment and mobile cooking facilities to support satellite programmes aimed at at-risk youth. The hostel and equipment will enable the applicant to deliver programmes for at-risk youth by leveraging off the Hawke's Bay Sports and Health Centre facilities. The project will target communities in Waipukurau, Flaxmere, Maraenui and Wairoa.
- 23. At the 7 November 2019 RED Ministers meeting, RED Ministers agreed with the PDU's recommendation to decline the project on the grounds that it did not fit within the PGF's criteria. However, RED Ministers referred the project to be considered for other forms of funding by the Ministers' of Regional Economic Development, Social Development, Health, Youth, and Sport and Recreation.
- 24. On 10 February 2020, the Minister of Finance and the Minister for Regional Economic Development considered this project as part of the Regional Investment Opportunities tagged

contingency, however, they directed officials to progress it through the tagged contingency Manifesto Commitments for the Regions.

25. At the 20 February 2020 RED Ministers meeting, RED Ministers will be asked to confirm their approval of the project. Should it be approved, the PDU recommendes the funding be drawn down from the tagged contingency Manifesto Commitments for the Regions.

#### Northland Water Shortage \$2.000 million

- 26. Parts of Northland are facing severe water shortages as a result of drought, particularly in Kaikohe, Kaitaia and Dargaville. Between the period 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> February 2020, RED Ministers agreed to allocate up to \$2.000 million from the Emerging Priorities contingency of the PGF for temporary water supply for Kaitaia and Kaikohe.
- 27. While the paper approved by RED Ministers references the Emerging Priorities contingency, in practice this is the tagged contingency Manifesto Commitments for the Regions Operating.

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
