Comments

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Purpose

This briefing seeks approval from Regional Economic Development (RED) Ministers for the use of the \$95,000 from the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) towards the Centre of Digital Excellence (CODE) business case as part of manifesto contingency funding.

Recommended action

The Provincial Development Unit (PDU) recommends that you:

a. **Note** that in October 2018 Senior Regional Officials (SROs) were informed of Dunedin City Council's Provincial Growth Fund application for \$95,000 towards the Centre of Digital Excellence business case. 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Background

1. On 25 October 2018, Senior Regional Officials (SRO) were informed of the PGF application for \$95,000 towards the CODE business case. As the project had been identified as a priority and agreed to in the Government Manifesto, SROs did not make a decision on the application.

2. Commercial Information

Since the completion of the business case, RED Ministers have approved PGF funding of \$10 million towards the development and implementation of CODE [3985 18-19 refers].

3. The below references the PDU's previous assessment of Dunedin City Council's request for \$95,000 towards the CODE business case, previously provided to SROs.

Project overview

- 4. The Labour Party Manifesto 2017 includes a commitment to invest \$10 million over 10 years to establish a CODE in Dunedin, with the vision of a \$1 billion computer gaming industry in New Zealand.
- 5. The Manifesto recognises that Dunedin is well-positioned to contribute to this vision through building on the city's emerging gaming and digital businesses, thriving start-up ecosystem, strong Māori partnerships, global linkages, and internationally-recognised academic centres.
- In order for the \$10 million to be released, a business case first had to be developed. The PGF provided Dunedin City Council with \$95,000 towards the completion of this business case following the below PDU assessment.

Local support

7. Commercial Information

However, it has a strong level of support from a number of large regional players.

8. This proposal has evidence of strong support from the Dunedin City Council, local District Councils, the University of Otago, and the Otago Polytechnic.



Benefits

- 9. The administration of the project will likely create some additional jobs, to be determined through the business case. In addition, if the project is successful then it has the possibility to help businesses develop and create additional jobs downstream.
- 10. The creation of a centre that helps train individuals and nurture start-up businesses has the potential to deliver significant flow on benefits to the community. By providing training opportunities to individuals via the University of Otago it will also add to the capabilities and offerings of the University.

Ownership and governance

11. The project has a strong governance structure with an experienced steering group containing representatives from a number of regional and national stakeholders. The business case outlined how Dunedin City will deliver on the overall project.

Risk assessment

- 12. Due diligence has been undertaken with no concerns identified.
- 13. The applicant identified the key risks of the project and their ranking. Risks associated with this project have been mitigated by the robust governance structure (steering group) in place.

Next steps

14. RED Ministers to approve the \$95,000 business case for the CODE as part of manifesto contingency funding.
