We recommend that the SROs:

a) Approve <u>\$58,923</u> from the He Poutama Rangatahi (HPR) fund towards the Kawerau Pathways to Work (KPTW) – Backbone Project Extension

b) Commercial Information

- c) Note that the KPTW Backbone Project underpins the wider KPTW Programme, by coordinating a response to the workforce demands generated through Industrial Symbiosis Kawerau and the Kawerau Pūtauaki Industrial Development (which has received investment of over \$2 million from the Provincial Growth Fund to date)
- d) Note that this funding request is for a 12-month extension to the current KPTW Backbone Project, enabling it to continue through to commercial information, and that this will bring it into alignment with the three projects referenced in recommendation (e), and help maintain collaboration between these projects
- e) Note that the KPTW Backbone Project has been effective in operationalising the KPTW Programme, as evidenced by the Kawerau-based funding applications listed below, which were approved by Senior Regional Officials in March/May 2019:
 - a. Kawerau District Council KPTW Programme, \$311,000 from HPR
 - b. Tuwharetoa Ki Kawerau Health, Education and Social Services Work-Ready On-Ramps Programme, \$658,000 from Te Ara Mahi (TAM) and HPR
 - c. Toi EDA Eastern BOP Commercial Driver and Operator Training Centre, \$598,600 from TAM and HPR
- f) Note that these programmes will collectively create employment and training opportunities for up to local residents per annum, in key sectors such as transport/logistics and forestry
- g) Note that the programme has the strong endorsement of the Bay of Plenty regional cross-agency government group, and support from the Ministry of Education

Proposal:

This proposal is for a 12-month extension of the current KPTW Backbone Project (from to connect More the bring it into alignment with several newly established programmes associated with the KPTW Programme. This alignment will ensure the continuity and sustainability of the work undertaken in both the KPTW Backbone Project and KPTW Programme and maintain the collaboration with Toi EDA's Driver and Operator Training Centre, and Ngati Tuwharetoa Ki Kawerau Hauora's On Ramps and Pastoral Care programmes. It will also ensure the interface with Tarawera High School is strengthened and, hopefully, embedded into their curriculum.

Wider benefits:

Extension of the Backbone Project to align with the KPTW Programme will consolidate the deliverables of both projects and work towards the sustainability of engagement between employers and rangatahi within the district. In turn, the programmes undertaken by Toi EDA and Tuwharetoa Ki Kawerau Health, Education and Social Services combined with the KPTW Programme will increase capacity and capability in the local workforce to enable them to take up the opportunities afforded by increased development in the district.

Stakeholder support:

The KPTW Programme is widely supported and has been created in response to iwi land-owner and community aspirations and forward plans for inclusive growth. The level of interest and local support for the programme has been demonstrated at regular community hui and employer workshops organised by KPTW in the last 12 months.
