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### **Strategic Tourism Assets Protection (STAPP)**

#### STAPP timeline

- 1. The STAPP application process will close on Thursday 18 June at 5.00pm. MBIE officials are expecting a large volume of applications will be received in the final 48 hours of the application period.
- 2. STAPP timeline:

- 3. As of 10am Tuesday 16 June, 67 applications have been received. None of these applications have indicated a need for urgent support. Businesses have indicated that the extension of the wage subsidy has significantly eased cost pressures.
- 4. **Annex One** provides an overview of applicants to date. Please note that this is a draft reporting template. Officials will also consider other reporting available, such as the Provincial Development Unit's when finalising the STAPP reporting template.
- 5. A draft assessment framework (used to assess eligible applications) can be found at **Annex Two**.

#### STAPP support to date

6. Funding agreements have been signed off with Whale Watch Kaikōura and AJ Hackett Bungy NZ. MBIE are still working with Discover Waitomo to finalise their funding agreement.

#### Wage subsidy extension

7. The STAPP programme is designed to maintain core strategic tourism assets up to a minimum viable product. Support received through the MSD wage subsidy and wage subsidy extension will be considered when determining how much funding an asset should get.

#### Regional Tourism Organisations funding progress

- 8. Tourism Recovery Ministers Group (TRMG) approved \$20.2 million for 31 RTOs, acknowledging their important role in supporting the tourism system. Local government support for many RTOs was at risk.
- 9. Eligibility for support extended to RTOs who as of 1 June 2020, were official members of Regional Tourism New Zealand (RTNZ). As the peak body for New Zealand's RTOs, RTNZ encourages better coordination amongst RTO's as well as engaging with RTOs and consulting on issues critical to the development of the regional tourism sector in New Zealand.
- 10. MBIE has been approached by other organisations outside of the RTNZ network that would be ineligible for STAPP RTO funding. These organisations include: Enterprise North Canterbury, Whanganui Māori Regional Tourism Organisation, Whakatāne District Council and the Chatham Islands.
- 11. RTNZ believe there could be up to 60 organisations across the country that undertake similar functions to RTOs at a district scale. MBIE is encouraging the 31 official RTO members to collaborate and partner with other organisations to ensure there is a coordinated and consistent approach in the region.
- 12. On Friday 12 June 2020, the Investment Plan template was sent out to all 31 RTOs for completion. These are due back to MBIE on 3 July 2020.
- 13. The Investment Plans will be assessed on a case-by-case basis and agreed between the RTO and MBIE. RTNZ will assist with the assessment and TNZ will provide advisory support as required.
- 14. On Tuesday 23 June 2020, RTNZ and MBIE will be running a workshop for the 31 RTOs. The workshop is an opportunity to discuss draft Investment Plans, TNZ's domestic marketing programme, share learnings and collaborate.
- 15. MBIE and RTNZ will undertake a short survey to establish a baseline, and inform what RTO Support Programme could look like over the following 12 months.

#### Other aspects of the tourism system

- 16. We anticipate that a large number of applications will not receive support through the STAPP, but collectively, may be of strategic importance to the tourism system. This includes Inbound Travel Operators (ITO), i-Site network and tourism trade events such as TRENZ.
- 17 We may recommend carving out funding for these collectively strategic aspects of the system like the funding approved for Regional Tourism Organisations (RTO) through the STAPP. We will provide you further information and recommendations in the coming weeks on this.

# **Tourism Transitions Programme**

18. Officials are working with New Zealand Trade and Enterprise on using the Regional Business Partners network. The next phase will look at further options, such as one-to-many supports and whether any ongoing costs can be mitigated by the Crown. Officials will provide an update for the next TRM meeting.

#### **New Zealand Futures Tourism Taskforce**

- 19. The New Zealand Futures Tourism Taskforce Co-Chairs will be attending the next Tourism Recovery Ministers Group meeting on Thursday 18 June 2020. This is an opportunity to meet the Co-Chairs, discuss initial ideas, membership and what you'll like the Co-Chairs to achieve.






