Strategic Tourism Assets Protection (STAPP)

STAPP Progress

- 1. The STAPP application process closed 5.00pm Thursday 18 June. A total of 304 applications were received before the applications closed.
- 2. A further four applications were received after applications closed. Officials have decided these applications are valid and will be assessed considering;
 - all four late applications were received on the day of closing (Thursday 18 June),
 - two applications were less than 5 minutes late, while the other two were within two hours late,
 - the application process ran for two weeks, which was an expedited process, and
 - allowing these four late applications will NOT adversely impact other applications.
- 3. This leaves a total of 308 valid STAPP applications. An overview of these applications is included in annex one.

Further pressure on timelines

- 4. Many applicants have indicated that they have applied for the wage subsidy extension. This will require funding amounts to be re-calculated and will extend the time needed to negotiate funding agreements with successful applicants.
- 5. On 22 June 2020, a budget bid to offset DOC concession fees was submitted to the TRMG. If this is successful, it will impact on a reasonable number of STAPP applications. Like the wage subsidy, MBIE would need to re-calculate funding amount if successful applicants requested support for DOC concession fees and will extend the time needed to negotiate funding agreements with successful applicants.

New Zealand Futures Tourism Taskforce

- 8. The co-chairs of the New Zealand Tourism Futures Taskforce released a public statement on Tuesday 23 June, to update the tourism sector on the progress for establishing the Taskforce membership. They also released the draft Terms of Reference for the Taskforce, in order to give the sector the opportunity to comment on the draft.
- 9. The co-chairs are still working to establish the membership of the core group of the Taskforce, as some of the proposed candidates are unavailable. They will update Ministers as soon as possible on any alternative options.
