Record of Decisions

1. DOC concessions paper

Ministers noted recommendations. It was further noted all Ministers have agreed to the DOC concessions paper 3828 19-20.

2. STAPP paper

Ministers noted recommendations. It was agreed wage subsidy and concessions would need to be taken into account for STAPP funding decisions. Minister Sage noted there should be analysis against the Four Capitals and the living wage.

3. ITO paper

Ministers noted and agreed all recommendations. Actions: MBIE to come back to TRM with criteria for ITO funding.

4. Tourism Transitions paper

Ministers noted and agreed all recommendations. MoF asked that RBP be evaluated before extending to tourism firms. Ministers noted need to avoid double-dipping.
