4.3 Te Ara Mahi (TAM)/He Poutama Rangatahi (HPR) update

Tairāwhiti update

The Tairāwhiti Road Transport Programme (TRTP) <u>http://eastlandwood.co.nz/growing-our-people/trt/</u> has been operating since 2018 with Ministry of Social Development and Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment funding, the latter through the Sector Workforce Employment Programme. TRTP has recently been successful in securing Provincial Growth Fund funding of just under \$1 million. This has allowed the programme to build resilience and capacity. In 2019, 86 drivers completed the programme and mare now employed.

Although the COVID 19 situation has seen a sharp downturn in log truck usage, this is being used as an opportunity for experienced drivers to use their time mentoring new drivers and training on equipment that is normally in use.

A Careers Expo is being held in Gisborne on 6 and 7 April and the TRTP and its key stakeholders will be present. Programme representatives will talk to students from the area on careers in the industry and the benefits of having a truck licence.

5. Policy Updates

5.1 Policy

Upper North Island Supply Chain work programme to May 2020

Ministry of Transport (MoT) officials met last week with two key Auckland iwi groups to discuss the Upper North Island Supply Chain Strategy (UNISCS) work programme – the Independent Māori Statutory Board (IMSB), and the five Marutūāhu iwi whose interests include Manukau and the Firth of Thames.

IMSB Chair David Taipari and Chief Executive Brandi Hudson attended the meeting. Commercial Information

Those attending the Marutūāhu meeting included Paul Majurey (Ngāti Maru and Chair of the Marutūāhu Collective). The meeting noted that historical treaty claim negotiations will be an important consideration.

Both groups appreciated the opportunity to engage, and requested further information. A workshop is being scheduled.

MoT Deputy Chief Executive Nick Brown will visit Hamilton and Tauranganext week to meet with representatives of the Port of Tauranga, the Bay of Plenty Regional Council and Tauranga City Council as well as local iwi. In Hamilton, he will meet with the partners in the Waikato's Future Proof Growth Strategy, including Waikato Regional Council and Hamilton City Council as well as tāngata whenua. He will also meet with representatives of Tainui Group Holdings, which co-owns the Ruakura Inland Port with the Port of Tauranga.

PDU Officials also recently met with the Infrastructure Commission, Te Waihanga, as part of the ongoing commitment to share information at key stages of the project.
