### 5.3 Te Ara Mahi (TAM)/He Poutama Rangatahi (HPR) update

#### Methamphetamine use and harm minimisation

Since mid-2019, the PDU has been working closely with Police and other agencies to address the harms of organised crime, particularly methamphetamine use, in Hawke's Bay and Tairāwhiti. Wellington-based and regional PDU Officials have been working with local Police, service providers, iwi, community groups and health specialists to identify response gaps and local support.

In September 2019, Cabinet agreed to an allocation of Te Ara Mahi funding for those harmed by methamphetamine use. In Hawke's Bay and Tairāwhiti, this funding can be used to support the responses that the local community has been developing, including possible residential facilities, community programmes that support individuals with addictions on the pathway to employment, and whānau support and counselling.

The PDU is also working in other regions in New Zealand, in particular Northland and Bay of Plenty, to identify successful providers of employment pathway addiction support programmes and address gaps identified by communities and employers. These proposals include initiatives that target different levels of addiction from "high need" through to "support and prevention".

### 6. Policy Updates

#### 6.1 Policy

#### Upper North Island Supply Chain work programme to May 2020

The Ministry of Transport (MoT), the Treasury, and the PDU continue to progress this work in accordance with the work programme agreed by Cabinet in December 2019.

Officials met with Infrastructure Victoria Chief Executive Michel Masson in Auckland last week to discuss his organisation's 2017 assessment of Victoria's port strategy. This considered a new port to supplement or replace the existing Port of Melbourne. Points covered in that discussion included supply chain efficiency, scale of port operations, gaining social licence and location of ports within the wider context of a national freight strategy.

Ministry officials will meet with two key Auckland iwi groups this week to discuss the Upper North Island Supply Chain Strategy (UNISCS) work programme. These groups are the Independent Māori Statutory Board and the five Marutūāhu iwi whose interests include Manukau and the Firth of Thames.

MoT Officials are meeting with Kiwirail this week to continue discussions on rail infrastructure and freight costs as part of the work programme.
