Application description

The Project

The project is the purchase of a specific piece of equipment, a Steam Cabinet Pasteuriser, by Parkers Beverage to enable a collective of food and beverage businesses (including Parkers) to have their finished product sterilised and packed locally vs having to send their products out of Hawkes Bay. The model of pasteuriser has a capacity of per day and the ability to do product runs as small as 500L. The current minimum volume expectation for out of town treatment is 10,000-15,000L. It is estimated that each partner company will experience about a \$ commercial inform benefit in the first year.

Affordability of and access to equipment are significant risks when developing new products and is a hurdle for business innovation. The new Parkers Beverage Company equipment and guaranteed access will reduce the business and development risk for product development and innovation.
