Parihaka Visitor Facilities	The contract for this project was executed this week. This project is part of the Historic Sites of National Significance allocation and is a notable project for the region due to the size of the agreement with a Māori Trust.

Hundertwasser Arts Centre and Wairaru Māori Art Gallery	Physical works for this project were able to recommence under Alert Level Three conditions; in response to the acceleration of construction, the funding recipient employed more resources to manage the increased level of health and safety requirements. It is likely they will need to employ even more resources to catch up on the time lost during the lockdown. The final flat concrete pour has been completed and the internal fit out commenced last week.

Te Rimu Trust - Lime Orchard Development	Te Rimu Trust has engaged Commercial Information to perform a Water Take Ecological Assessment to inform the Water Take Consent. It is likely that funds set aside for contingency will be utilised to support this. Once completed, the Trust will be able to receive their consent.

The Food Factory	The first Food Factory tenant, Little Beauties, moved in on 20 May 2020. Little Beauties is a scale-up business that processes local produce into dried fruit products (e.g. kiwfruit, feijoas and boysenberries). They will have staff on-site doing added-value production. The second tenant, Fresh2U, is planned to move into the space on Monday. There is a pipeline of enquiries from prospective tenants and further promotion of the site, alongside a new website, will be happening in the next few days. A plan for communications is currently being formulated.
