Otago Workforce Development Programme

The Otago Chamber of Commerce's application for a \$1,850,000 grant to support the Otago Workforce Development Programme was approved by RED Ministers on 7 May 2020. The contract was executed on 11 June. The Programme will be based at WorkForce Central (WFC) beside the new Dunedin Hospital (NDH) build. WFC will support the upskilling of the local workforce to meet the demand for construction workers for the hospital project. Demolition has already begun onsite and the trained workforce requirement for the NDH build will exceed the current availability. It is estimated that the NDH build alone will generate a minimum of trade-related employment opportunities for at least commercial information, including apprenticeships, supervisors and highly qualified roles. A wider regional need of at least people to be engaged and supported into training, and progress into construction projects in the region has also been identified.

Te Rūnanga o Ngā Wairiki Ngāti Apa Programme
