## Plan of Action Against Forced Labour, People Trafficking and Slavery

Portfolio Workplace Relations and Safety

On 9 December 2020, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee:

- 1 noted that forced labour, people trafficking and slavery have been identified in New Zealand, and present a risk that must be addressed through an effective all-ofgovernment response;
- 2 **noted** that on 22 May 2019, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee agreed to ratify the *International Labour Organization's Protocol of 2014 to the Forced Labour Convention, 1930 (No. 29)* (the Forced Labour Protocol) [DEV-19-MIN-0122];
- noted that the Forced Labour Protocol enters into force for New Zealand on 13 December 2020, and to meet its requirements New Zealand is required to have a national plan of action addressing forced labour;
- 4 **noted** that a national *Plan of Action to Prevent People Trafficking* has been in place since 2009, but needs to be updated to reflect new developments since that time and expanded to capture a wider range of practices connected with modern slavery;
- 5 **noted** that the *Plan of Action against Forced Labour, People Trafficking and Slavery, 2020-2025* (the Plan of Action), attached to the paper under DEV-20-SUB-0178, will support an effective all-of-government response to address and reduce these connected practices;
- 6 **noted** that public consultation was undertaken on a draft Plan of Action, and that the feedback received from this process has been taken into account in its development;
- agreed to the Plan of Action, subject to any minor editorial changes that may be required;
- 8 **agreed** that the Plan of Action be publicly released;
- **noted** that officials will report to the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety annually on progress, and quarterly in the first year, in implementing the Plan of Action.
