- HortNZ welcomes the opportunity to submit on the proposed country of origin labelling regulations and is joined in this submission by AS Wilcox and Sons, Balle Bros, Citrus NZ, Hawkes Bay Fruitgrowers Association, Katikati Fruitgrowers Association, MG Marketing, NZ Apples and Pears, NZ Kiwifruit Growers, Onions NZ, Potatoes NZ, Strawberry Growers NZ, TandG Global, Tamarillos NZ, Tomatoes NZ, Vegetables NZ, and United Fresh,

We support the making of these regulations in so far as they are applicable to the sale of fresh fruit and vegetables with the origin statement being on the bin, or the packaging or on the label whichever is most appropriate to the product display with that decision being made by the grower, distributor or retailer as best fits the situation.
- 4. We question the definition of fruit or vegetable at regulation 4(c) that excludes legumes and herbs growing in soil from the definition of vegetables as both these categories are typically considered vegetables. We do not understand this distinction.
