

No funding has been provided to the Trust at this stage because the ongoing developments have delayed finalisation of a contract. PDU officials are liaising with the Ministry of Education in Wellington and regionally to understand the impact of these changes for the school, the status of the Independent Trust, and the Academy.

#### 6. Policy update

# Cabinet Paper: Raising the profile and strengthening the pipeline into vocational education

This week Cabinet agreed to the Minister of Education's Reform of Vocational Education (ROVE) initiatives that will support the pipeline of students coming into the vocational education system.

One of the initiatives is a new education-to-employment brokerage service that will strengthen connections between local employers and schools. This initiative involves funding up to mew brokerage positions based at Regional Economic Development Agencies (EDAs), or similar regional economic-focused organisations, for two years from early 2020. These brokers will build local relationships to support vocational opportunities for students. In future, the initiative will transition to be supported by the Regional Skills Leadership Groups (RSLGs).

Over the last three years, the Sector Workforce Engagement Programme (SWEP) team has jointly funded a Schools Engagement Facilitator (through the Ara Jobs and Skills Hub) to work with low decile schools in South Auckland by providing students with opportunities to consider careers in trades or associated industries. This includes work experience, skills training and career expos. Lessons learned from this work can help inform the development of these new roles.

The PDU will work with Ministry of Social Development (as the lead agency for operationalising this initiative) to support the establishment of the brokerage roles, and work with EDAs to support the transition. We will keep you updated as it progresses.
