Tourism Recovery Fund: Clarity on STAPP grant and loan funding

Purpose

This briefing seeks clarity on the grant and loan funding decisions for successful Strategic Tourism Assets Protection Programme (STAPP) applicants made during the Tourism Recovery Ministers' (TRM) meeting on Friday, 24 July 2020.

Decisions on STAPP funding were made by Tourism Recovery Ministers

- 1. At the TRM meeting on Friday 24 July, TRM agreed successful STAPP applicants and other COVID-19 tourism recovery initiatives through the Tourism Recovery Fund.
- 2. The TRM meeting minutes from Friday 24 July (see **Annex One**, also *briefing 2021-0368 refers*) reflect that:
 - a. Ministers agreed that all STAPP applications rated 15/30 points and above be approved with a grant of up to \$500,000 for the first year. All remaining funding requested would be made available via a loan scheme. The grant would not be dependent on confirmation of the loan.
- 3. Since then, MBIE has notified all successful applicants ahead of the Ministerial announcement on Saturday 1 August.

Clarifying TRM STAPP grant funding decisions

- 4. Ministers have now received the confirmed list of successful applicants, split by grant and loan allocation as agreed (*briefing 2021-0368 refers*). The list has highlighted that some applicants requested less than \$500,000 for year one but also requested funding for year two. This has raised some questions for Ministers around the decision to limit grant funding to year one only.
- 5. The Minister of Tourism's office has now requested that officials present an additional option to spread the grant of up to \$500,000 across two years and seek an updated decision from TRM.
- 6. Two decisions remain unchanged:
 - a. That the agreed grant funding is up to \$500,000 per asset
 - b. Any additional funding sought will be made available via a loan.
- 7. To ensure we can get updated decisions to applicants ahead of the announcement on Saturday 1 August, TRM now need to urgently clarify whether the grant funding of up to \$500,000 is to be made available across one or two years.

Two options for TRM urgent decision

Option One: Successful STAPP applicants are eligible for a grant of up to \$500,000 for the first year only (as per the minutes of the TRM meeting of 24 July)

- 8. On 24 July, TRM agreed that a grant should be made available for one year only because the grant is essentially an 'emergency payment' to reflect the impact of COVID-19 on tourism businesses. Funding for the second year was agreed to be available in the form of a loan scheme.
- 9. The list of successful applicants split by grants of up to \$500,000 for the first year only and remaining funding via loans is summarised in **Annex Two**.
- 10. An example of option One is if a tourism STAPP applicant requests \$800,000 over two years. A successful applicant would be offered a grant for year one of \$400,000 and be offered an optional loan for year two of \$400,000.
- 11. This option reflects the decisions made and agreed in the TRM minutes of 24 July. Letters have been sent to successful applicants in line with this agreement.

12. MBIE officials endorse the decisions made by TRM for up to \$500,000 for year one only, as best aligning with the policy intent of the STAPP.

Option Two: Successful STAPP applicants are eligible for grants of up to \$500,000 to be paid over two years (if an applicant has requested funding over two years and the year one amount is less than \$500,000)

- 13. Option Two allows for grants of up to \$500,000 to be paid out over two years. If an applicant has requested funding over two years and the year one amount is less than \$500,000, then additional grant funding would be made available in year two for the remainder of the \$500,000.
- 14. An example of option Two is if a tourism STAPP applicant requests \$800,000 over two years. The successful applicant would be offered a grant for year one of \$400,000 and then be offered a grant of \$100,000 for year two, along with an optional loan for year two of up to \$300,000.
- 15. To minimise risks to the Crown, we would anticipate control points through scheduled payments, such as a 50% payment up front and two further payments of 25% across the period for which funding is made available.
- 16. If Option Two is agreed, officials will also need to contact affected businesses to notify them of the change to the grant and loan offer ahead of the announcement on Saturday 1 August. While additional funding in the form of a grant to some businesses will be welcome news, there may be some negative responses and concerns raised, also likely confusion, due to the change in decision and communication.

Next steps

Letters to successful applicants have already been sent out

- 17. In order to prepare the necessary communications material ahead of the announcement on Saturday 1 August, MBIE has already sent out letters to successful applicants.
- 18. The letters have advised successful STAPP applicants they are eligible for a grant of up to \$500,000 for the first year only.
- 19. If Ministers decide on Option Two, MBIE will need to make further contact with affected businesses to update them on the decision. 44 of the 126 successful applicants will need to have new letters issued as their first year funding falls below \$500,000 (6 assets fall below \$500,000 in the first year, but do not require funding in the second year, so are not counted in the 44). The sooner TRM make decisions, the sooner we can clarify the outcome with affected applicants.

Announcement scheduled on Saturday, 1 August

- 20. Pending your decision, MBIE will continue working towards announcing successful STAPP applicants on Saturday, 1 August.
- 21. If updated letters are sent to affected STAPP applicants they may not be named in the announcement.

Record of Decisions

1. Inbound Tour Operators Funding

Ministers agreed that up to \$20 m would be available for Inbound Tour Operators via loans.

2. Stimulating the Domestic Tourism Market through Events

Ministers agreed to establish a \$50 million Regional Events Fund. Ministers raised some concerns about the most effective mechanism to deliver the Fund and requested officials report back on options, including delivery via the existing Domestic Events Fund (current allocation \$10m). MBIE officials will report back to TRM on Monday 27 July.

3. Lifting Digital Capability in the Tourism Sector

Ministers agreed to:

- \$5 million to Qualmark to provide a service to help tourism operators develop digital strategies and access digital tools, and
- \$5 million to the existing Digital Enablement Package, in order that tourism businesses can specifically benefit from the work that has already been undertaken, this stream would also encourage businesses to join Qualmark.

Follow up note: Minister Davis to forward paper to Minister of Small Business, responsible for the Digital Enablement Package.

4. Strategic Tourism Assets Protection Programme

- Ministers agreed that generic accommodation was not eligible for the STAPP. However, three accommodation providers are eligible due to their significance as tourism attractions to their regions in their own right, with their accommodation offerings being secondary features of the business. These are Larnach Castle, The Hermitage and The Duke of Marlborough.
- Ministers noted that there is to be no double dipping across government COVID-19
 response packages. For example, if applicants received funding from DOC's Wildlife
 Institutions Relief Fund those funding components would need to be removed from the
 STAPP application.
- Ministers discussed some assets funded by local government and agreed that stadiums and convention centres were ineligible. Ministers agreed that some assets funded by local government were eligible, such as Auckland Art Gallery, Auckland Zoo and New Zealand Maritime Museum.
- Ministers agreed that STAPP applications for Commercial Information and Commercial Information be removed and considered separately.
- Ministers recommended that Commercial Information be declined as the Commercial Information be declin
- Ministers agreed that all other applications rated 15/30 points and above be approved with a grant of up to \$500,000 for the first year. All remaining funding requested would be available via a loan scheme. The grant would not be dependent on confirmation of the loan.
- Ministers discussed a number of options to operationalise a loan scheme, either by adapting an existing loan scheme, standing up a new loan scheme or contracting a bank to deliver it. Further work needs to be undertaken to explore these options. Officials from the Treasury and MBIE will provide advice on options over the coming weeks.
- Ministers agreed to support all M\u00e3ori tourism businesses on the eligible STAPP list, including those ranked lower than 15/30 points. New Zealand M\u00e3ori Tourism confirmed that the amount of funding sought by M\u00e3ori businesses amounted to \$21 million (excluding Te Puia). Ministers agreed to allocate \$21 million to M\u00e3ori tourism

businesses (from the eligible STAPP applicant list). Funding terms will be the same as the other STAPP successful applicants with a grant of up to \$500,000 and an optional loan making up the total of the requested funding. MBIE officials will work with New Zealand Māori Tourism ahead of any announcement to clarify roles and implementation.

 Ministers agreed that MBIE's work on conditionality for funding is critical and should be progressed as agreed previously.

5. Next Steps and announcements

- Minister Davis will announce the tourism package on Thursday, 30 July 2020. Ministers agreed that not all approved STAPP applicants will be announced but a selection of businesses will be.
- On Monday, officials will:
 - a. Provide a comprehensive communications plan for Thursday's announcements to TRM
 - b. send an update on the STAPP funding allocation by successful applicant based on the Ministers' decisions.
 - c. send letters to successful applicants by close of business and seek confirmation on whether the business name can be included in the announcement. Officials intend on informing unsuccessful applicants at the time of announcement and will provide information on the support available via the Tourism Transitions Programme.
 - d. Provide TRM with an update on options for the delivery mechanism for the Events Fund.
