Minute of Decision

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Building Regulations: Proposed Amendments to Minimise Unnecessary Regulatory Impacts on the Building and Construction Sector

Portfolio Building and Construction

On 7 July 2021, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee:

Amending the commencement date of the general competency regulation

- noted that the Building (Product Certification) Amendment Regulations 2019 (the 2019 Regulations) were intended to improve the competency and quality of product certification bodies in the product certification scheme;
- 2 **noted** that unnecessary regulatory impacts have been identified in complying with the general competency regulation, whereby product certification bodies may only accept product test reports from laboratories that are accredited for those tests;
- agreed to amend the 2019 Regulations by extending their commencement date by 12 months, from 1 November 2021 to 1 November 2022;
- 4 **noted** that extending the commencement date provides certainty and regulatory continuity while new CodeMark regulations are made;
- noted that officials are undertaking work, as part of the Building System Legislation Reform Programme, to strengthen the product certification scheme and provide more confidence in the quality of certificates issued by product certification bodies;
- 6 **noted** that the Minister for Building and Construction intends to seek agreement to policy proposals for new CodeMark regulations in October 2021, and to bring the final regulations to Cabinet for approval in Confidential advice to Government

Removing references to method for payment of infringement fees

- 7 **noted** that the Building (Infringement Offences, Fees, and Forms) Regulations 2007 (the 2007 Regulations) require enforcement authorities to accept payment by cheque or money order for the payment of infringement fees;
- 8 **noted** that by mid-2021, most major banks will no longer accept cheques as a form of payment;
- **agreed** to amend the 2007 Regulations to remove references to method for payment of infringement fees;

Legislative implications

- invited the Minister for Building and Construction to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to the above paragraphs;
- authorised the Minister for Building and Construction to make minor or technical amendments, consistent with the policy decisions relating to the paper under DEV-21-SUB-0152.
