Dear Privacy of natural persons

Thank you for your email of 29 July 2021, requesting under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

"1. How many applications have been made to Immigration NZ for subsequent Talent Accredited Work to Residency work visas since February 2020 to the date of the response of this complaint? 2. How many of those applicants for subsequent Talent Accredited Work to Residency work visas were granted 24-month visas?

3. How many of those applicants for subsequent Talent Accredited Work to Residency work visas were granted 30-month visas?

4. Any information Immigration NZ holds in relation to processing subsequent Talent Accredited Work to Residency visas including internal directions to staff, internal policies and guidance, internal communications between staff."

Our Response

Question 1

There were 72 applications submitted to Immigration New Zealand (INZ) for subsequent Talent Accredited Work to Residence work visas from 1 February 2020 to 13 August 2021.

Question 2

From the 72 applications mentioned above, 10 were approved for a 24 month period visa.

Question 3

44 of the applicants were approved for a 30 month visa validity.

Exemptions under subsequent work visa WR1.30.1 ACT

A subsequent Talent (Accredited Employers) work visa application may be approved despite

- the applicant is not aged 55 years or under; and/or
- not holding an offer of employment in New Zealand from an accredited employer; and/or .
- the offer of employment is not for a period of at least 24 months; and/or .
- . Not having an offer of employment for a position with a minimum base salary of NZ\$79,560 per annum

if the applicant:

- holds a Talent (Accredited Employers) work visa at the time they apply; and .
- has made an application for residence under the Talent (Accredited Employers) residence instructions and a decision on that residence . application is yet to be made; and
- has an offer of employment that: .
 - is for a period of at least 12 months; and
 - Is for the same employer that is supporting their application for residence under the Accredited Employer residence instructions.
 - continues to meet the minimum base salary that was in place when they applied for their current visa, i.e., NZ\$55,000; and
 - meets all other requirements of WR1.10, except (a), (c) and (g).

If approved, duration will be up to a maximum of 24 months.
