On 8 November 2021, Cabinet:

- 1 **noted** that on 26 October 2021 Cabinet agreed to proposals to strengthen the approach to COVID-19 vaccination requirements in the workplace [CAB-21-MIN-0436];
- 2 **noted** the briefing from the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety (the Minister) on the progress of the further work being undertaken in respect of workplace vaccinations and the proposed risk assessment framework;
- 3 **noted** that the Minister will be submitting a paper on the proposals to Cabinet on 15 November 2021;
- 4 **invited** the Minister to consult further with the Minister of Health, the Attorney-General and the Minister for Maori Development on the proposed risk assessment framework.
