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Fees for the New Accredited Employer Work Visa

Portfolio Immigration

On 16 February 2022, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee (DEV):

New Accredited Employer Work Visa

1 noted that on 28 August 2019, DEV approved the high level design of the new Accredited Employer Work Visa (the AEWV) [DEV-19-MIN-0228];

New fees associated with the Accredited Employer Work Visa

- 2 **noted** that:
 - 2.1 the proposed fees aim to support and implement the three gateway framework for the AEWV;
 - 2.2 the proposed fees accord with guidance from the Treasury and Office of the Auditor-General;
 - 2.3 the process to calculate the costs and fees was robust, using the best available data;
 - 2.4 the approach to cost recovery and fee setting accords with the practice for setting other fees within the Immigration portfolio;
 - 2.5 the proposed fees will recover the full costs of the AEWV from employers and migrant workers;
- 3 **agreed** to the new fee structure and levels, as set out below:

- 4 **noted** that on 10 November 2021, DEV agreed to a first principles review of the immigration funding model, beginning with an interim review of fees and levies in 2022, with new rates anticipated to take effect from July 2022 [DEV-21-MIN-0221];
- 5 Confidential advice to Government

Fee waivers for employers who currently hold accreditation

- 6 **agreed** to an exemption to the proposed employer accreditation fee for employers who hold accreditation under the Work to Residence Talent (Accredited Employers) scheme with more than six months duration remaining at 9 May 2022;
- noted that approximately 1,070 employers hold accreditation under the Work to Residence Talent (Accredited Employers) scheme with more than six months duration remaining at 9 May 2022;
- 8 **noted** that paragraph 6 above is expected to result in a loss of revenue of approximately \$850,000 (based on the fees proposed above and assuming that not all employers take up the new accreditation);
- 9 noted that this revenue is accounted for by sharing the cost as an overhead across all other related fees, over a period of seven years;

Exemption of new AEWV from the International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy

- 10 **noted** that on 12 September 2018, DEV agreed that:
 - 10.1 the purpose of International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy is to fund investment in conservation and tourism;
 - 10.2 the Levy will be paid by all people applying for:
 - 10.2.1 an electronic travel authority (visa waiver travellers);
 - 10.2.2 visitor visas or short term entry visas (12 months or less);

11 **noted** that as AEWVs are longer term work visas, the decisions referred to in paragraph 10 above mean the AEWVs will be exempt from the International Visitor Conservation and Tourism Levy;

Legislative implications

- 12 noted that the Immigration (Visa, Entry Permission and Related Matters) Regulations 2010 need to be amended to give effect to the above paragraphs;
- 13 **invited** the Minister of Immigration to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to the above paragraphs;
