#### Issue

- You discussed and agreed to a new process for assessing group allocation requests for MIQ space and support in February [2021-1728 refers]. This process clarifies that the Border Exceptions Ministerial Group will make decisions on group allocations as well as class exceptions.

#### **Dear Ministers**

We are writing to you as the Minister with responsibility for the COVID-19 response and the chair of the Border Exceptions Ministerial Group. As you will all be aware, MIQ is facing significant pressures due to strong demand for space from returning New Zealanders as well as from critical workers. Given the limited number of spaces available online to book in managed isolation, MIQ is receiving an increasingly large number of requests for the manual allocation of vouchers to groups and individuals, including both New Zealanders and those holding relevant visas. To manage these requests, we have approved a new process for evaluating and prioritising proposals for group arrivals into MIQ.

We have agreed to expand the remit of the Border Exceptions Ministerial Group to include decisions on which groups requesting entry into New Zealand are manually allocated vouchers. The Border Exceptions Ministerial Group was established to consider requests for border exceptions from workforces and other groups of visa holders who did not meet current border exception criteria, when there was a clear case supporting their entry to New Zealand for economic, social or cultural reasons. In making decisions for group exceptions, we are required to give practical consideration to MIQ total capacity, MIQ timing, MIQ facility requirements and public health risk (CAB-20-MIN-0435 refers).

Being responsible for the manual allocation of vouchers to groups not requiring border exceptions will provide us with more visibility of the pipeline of demand for spaces in managed isolation. It will allow us to more easily prioritise requests and align decisions on border exceptions and the allocation of space in MIQ. Any proposals for group allocations will require approval from the relevant portfolio Minister. If you would like to put forward a proposal for this process, we would like to reiterate that:

- There is a high bar for approval: manually allocating rooms to groups reduces the number
  of rooms available for New Zealanders and other critical workers to use and therefore
  should only be done when it will result in significant public benefits.
- We wish to remind Ministers to only refer requests within their portfolios that they deem
  to be the highest priority: given the small number of rooms available for group allocations,
  we would like to remind Ministers to prioritise requests within their respective portfolios
  before taking a proposal to the Border Exceptions Ministerial Group. Not all groups will be
  able to be accommodated.
- Supporting implementation: If proposals are approved, agencies are expected to provide sufficient support to MBIE, especially when there are requests for bespoke requirements.
   These groups can often be high-needs are require considerable support from MIQ staff to ensure they are safely accommodated.
