Purpose

To provide the June report on progress against the Government's commitment to ensure that Critical Workers are occupying at least 10% of spaces in Managed Isolation and Quarantine (the 10% Critical Worker target).

During May 2021 Critical Workers (and accompanying family) occupied an average of 13.7% of MIQ rooms.

The updated information, attached at Annex One, will be released on the MBIE website in mid-June.

10% Critical Worker Target

Context

- 1. In December 2020 Cabinet agreed to set a 10% operational target for Critical Workers' use of allocable managed isolation rooms over a rolling three month period, starting 1 January 2021 [CBC-20-MIN-0137 refers].
- 2. In April 2021, officials reported on progress in developing information to track progress against this target. Following that briefing you indicated you wished to receive monthly reports, which would then be publicly released [briefing 2021-2756 refers].

June Report

Key findings

- 3. The June report against the 10% Critical Worker Target is attached as Annex One.
- 4. This report includes the average MIQ occupancy used by critical workers and their accompanying family during May 2021, which was 13.7%.

5. Table one, below, sets out the average daily occupancy of MIQ rooms by critical workers for each month reported thus far.

Table 1: Average MIQ occupancy of critical workers by month

6. The average over a rolling three month period (1 March to 31 May 2021) was 12.8%.

Observations of note

- 7. Critical worker occupancy of MIQ rooms appears to be stabilising.
 - a. In May's report we noted that the proportion of MIQ rooms used by critical workers was rising throughout the latter half of April. It was suggested that this may have been due to lower overall MIQ occupancy meaning that a similar number of workers made up a larger proportion of the daily occupancy.
 - b. We indicated that if this trend continued it could result in critical workers occupying a growing proportion of MIQ rooms.
 - c. Updated information shows that this trend did not continue, instead peaking in early May before stabilising between 10% and 12% for the latter part of May despite continued low occupancy.




Figure 2: Daily and average MIQ occupancy by critical workers

- 8. Figure 2, below, illustrates this data of the last three months.

Managed Isolation and Quarantine: Critical worker occupancy

June 2021

Report period: 1 January 2021 to 31 May 2021

- The above table sets out the proportion of occupied MIQ rooms that are occupied by a critical worker.
- This is calculated by averaging the percentage of rooms occupied by critical workers on each day in the calendar month.

Context notes

- Data for January 2021 to March 2021 includes the arrivals of Recognised Seasonal Employer (RSE) horticultural and viticulture workers. This large group of additional critical workers resulted in a higher-than-usual percentage of MIQ rooms being used for critical workers during these months.
- The start of Quarantine Free Travel with Australia reduced the total number of people entering MIQ. This saw rooms used by critical workers make up a higher proportion of the MIQ rooms that are occupied over April and May 2021.

Caveats and Definitions

"Critical workers" include temporary visa holders entering New Zealand under the "other critical worker", "critical health worker", and "normally resident work visa holder" border exceptions, including any family members entering the country with that worker.

Data for reporting on critical worker occupancy in MIQ has been collated from 1 January 2021.

This report reflects a snapshot at a point time from various operational data sources.
