Government Response to the Report of the Petitions Committee on the Petition of Trade Aid and World Vision New Zealand: Take Action against Modern Slavery

Portfolio Workplace Relations and Safety

On 5 May 2022, the Cabinet Legislation Committee:

- **noted** that, on 14 February 2022, the Petitions Committee presented its report to the House entitled "Petition of Trade Aid and World Vision New Zealand: Take Action against Modern Slavery";
- 2 **noted** that the Petitions Committee recommended that the government bring legislation addressing modern slavery before the House as soon as possible, while allowing for adequate policy development and public consideration;
- noted that, on 8 April, the government released the discussion document *A legislative response to modern slavery and worker exploitation* (the Discussion Document) as agreed by the Cabinet Economic Development Committee [DEV-22-MIN-0027], which was developed in consultation with the petitioners as members of the Modern Slavery Leadership Advisory Group;
- 4 **noted** that the government response attached to the submission under LEG-22-SUB-0054 supports the recommendation of the Petitions Committee and sets out how the legislative proposal in the discussion document referred to in paragraph 3 above is consistent with the Petitions Committee's recommendation;
- **approved** the government response, attached to the submission under LEG-22-SUB-0054, to the Report of the Petitions Committee entitled "Petition of Trade Aid and World Vision New Zealand: Take Action against Modern Slavery";
- 6 **noted** that the government response must be presented to the House the week commencing 9 May 2022;
- 7 **invited** the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety to present the Government response to the House in accordance with Standing Order 380;
