  - Who should collect a fine?
  - Imposing fines for camping in an illegal area
  - > Confiscation of non-compliant vehicles returned with bond repaid after made compliant
  - Licensing of rental companies who must be compliant or license is cancelled
  - Local Government inspectors to implement and collect fines
  - > Airport Authorities alerted to unpaid fines which must be paid before leaving New Zealand

  - > All vehicles (certified or not) need to be certified according to the new legislation

#### CONCLUSION

In most New Zealand locations there are numerous Council owned and privately owned Motor Camps. Councils also have land available for the creation of freedom camping sites that are not recreational reserves. By placing all freedom campers in such locations would mean:

- Economic benefit to site providers
- Free up public carparks
- Stop the taking over of prime sites (beach fronts, lake fronts, tourist attractions
- Prevent the pollution of prime sites
- Give the public access to enjoy such prime sites
- > Reduce the abuse of public facilities (Council provided toilets)
