Section 15 of the Proposed PVR Act reads as follows

"15 Exception to PVR: farm-saved seed (1) This section applies if a person engaged in farming activities (a farmer)— (a) lawfully obtains seed— (i) of a protected variety; or 10 (ii) of a plant variety that is essentially derived from, or is dependent on, a protected variety; and (b) in the course of their farming activities, grows plants from that seed; and (c) harvests seed from those plants.

(2) However, this section does not apply in relation to a plant variety of a kind specified in the regulations as one to which this section does not apply."

In the proposed regulations reference in 15 subsection (2) above refers to "...as specified in the regulations..." The regulations do not include any connection back to this.

In discussions with Aidan Burch and Chris Barnaby they have clarified that potatoes are excluded from farm saved seed, specifically in an email from Aidan on 22 November 2021 he states

"Hi Tony,

Thanks for your email. I can confirm that potatoes won't be caught by the farm-saved seed provisions as they are not a seed.

Cheers, Aidan"

In no place in the PVR Act or Regulations does it state that potatoes are excluded from provisions for farm-saved seed. I think for the purpose of absolute clarity and connection back to the PVR Act that potatoes need to be named as being excluded from the provisions for farm-saved seed. Simply failing to list specifically will create ambiguity.
