Minimum Wage Review 2022

Portfolio Workplace Relations and Safety

On 6 December 2022, the Cabinet Priorities Committee:

- noted that the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment has provided the Minimum Wage Review 2022, attached to the submission under CPC-22-SUB-0048, and recommends a 6 percent increase in the minimum wage to \$22.50;
- **noted** that Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment's recommendation is based on an analysis that is informed by two quarters of confirmed, and two quarters of forecast, Consumers Price Index (CPI) data as at the point in time of the Minimum Wage Review 2022;
- noted that the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety (the Minister) is of the view that due to the uncertain economic situation, and particularly uncertainty about the inflation environment, a decision on setting the minimum wage rate for 2023 should wait for the December 2022 CPI data to be released on 25 January 2023 this would allow a decision based on the most up to date inflation and other economic data;
- 4 **authorised** the Minister of Finance and the Minister to signal that the 2023 minimum wage rate will be announced in January 2023;
- 5 **invited** the Minister to report-back to Cabinet in January 2023 with the December CPI data.
