Opening and introduction		The Chair provided opening remarks and invited guest speakers from NZTE, NZGCP and Callaghan to present on key activities they are undertaking to build the startup ecosystem. NZGCP Chief Executive highlighted the work they are doing to support startups has three main objectives. This includes building the base, growing capability and fostering collaboration and connectivity. He discussed		

			<p>recent changes to NZGCP's parameters and their strategic approach to funding in current economic conditions.</p> <p>NZTE Chief Executive shared reflections on New Zealand's early-stage ecosystem. He noted that NZTE currently focuses on innovation and growing value-added companies across the three significant export sectors of manufacturing, FBCG (Food and Beverage Consumer Goods) and tech and innovation. 80% of NZTE's resources go into the 1400 Focus companies. He also noted some of the challenges and opportunities, including the need for a consistent approach to framing strategic objectives, and gave his perspective on the weaknesses of the ecosystem in areas like strategic intent, followership, and collaboration.</p> <p>Callaghan Innovation Chief Executive spoke about their role in supporting the startup ecosystem. He highlighted that their role encompasses four main components: Provision of research, development and innovation funding/grants, upskilling, commercialization (access to deep-tech problem solving and scientists) and connectivity in the ecosystem. He also highlighted the opportunities in place, including new grants available to support startups with activities such as market research and validation.</p>
