Incorporated Societies Act 2022: Proposed Regulations

Portfolio Commerce and Consumer Affairs

On 17 May 2023, the Cabinet Economic Development Committee:

Background

- 1 **noted** that on 5 April 2022, the Incorporated Societies Act 2022 (the 2022 Act) received Royal Assent;
- 2 **noted** that the 2022 Act gives the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs the power to recommend regulations for various purposes relating to incorporated societies;
- 3 **noted** that:
 - 3.1 new regulations are required to implement provisions in the 2022 Act so that the new regime can function effectively;
 - 3.2 these must be in place by 5 October 2023 when the relevant provisions of the Act come into force;

Policy proposals

- 4 **noted** that the proposals for new regulations outlined in the paper under DEV-23-SUB-0085 can be split into two groups:
 - 4.1 base regulations comprising regulations necessary to give effect to the purposes of the 2022 Act in relation to matters that are uncontroversial;
 - 4.2 top-up regulations comprising regulations necessary to give effect to the purposes of the 2022 Act where there is genuine scope to consider different options for what those regulations provide for;
- 5 **agreed** to the proposals for the base regulations, as set out in the table in Annex 1 to the paper under DEV-23-SUB-0085;
- 6 **agreed** to the proposals for the top-up regulations, as set out in the table in Annex 2 to the paper under DEV-23-SUB-0085;
- 7 Confidential advice to Government

Legislative implications

- 8 **noted** that on 29 September 2022, the Cabinet Government Administration and Expenditure Review Committee authorised the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office for an exposure draft of the regulations ahead of obtaining policy approval [GOV-22-MIN-0034], but that the preference now is to seek policy agreement to the proposals outlined in paragraphs 5 and 6 above;
- 9 **invited** the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office to give effect to paragraphs 5 and 6 above;
- **authorised** the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to approve the release of an exposure draft of the proposed regulations if there is time in the drafting process to do so;
- **authorised** the Minister of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to make decisions consistent with the overall policy decisions in the paper under DEV-23-SUB-0085 on any matters that might arise during the drafting process or as a result of consultation on an exposure draft of the regulations.
