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New Zealand's Future Quarantine and Isolation Capability

Portfolio COVID-19 Response

On 19 December 2022, following reference from the Cabinet Social Wellbeing Committee (SWC), Cabinet:

Background

- **noted** that the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) currently remains responsible for identifying opportunities to strengthen New Zealand's future quarantine and isolation capability, and maintaining operational readiness to re-establish managed isolation and quarantine (MIQ) (via the Readiness Plan);
- 2 **noted** that in December 2020, Cabinet:
 - 2.1 approved funding of \$1,468.272 million in the Isolation and Quarantine Management Multi-Category Appropriation for MBIE's quarantine and isolation activities;
 - 2.2 agreed that the funding in the above appropriation is ring-fenced to MIQ and cannot be transferred to other appropriations, and that once MIQ winds down any remaining funding is to be returned to the Crown;

- 3 **noted** that the Isolation and Quarantine Management Appropriation within Vote Building and Construction, under which MBIE's remaining quarantine and isolation activities are conducted, ends on 30 June 2023;
- 4 **noted** that MBIE currently estimates a \$22 million underspend in the above appropriation, which will be returned to the Crown in June 2023, subject to any Cabinet decisions to reprioritise the underspend;

New Zealand's future quarantine and isolation capability

5 **noted** that a programme business case has considered three options for retaining and strengthening New Zealand's future quarantine and isolation capability beyond 30 June 2023;

- 6 **agreed** to fund the continued maintenance, testing, and maturation of New Zealand's existing Readiness Plan, plus the development of a long-term quarantine and isolation capability strategy, and investment in an evolving portfolio of (contracted) self, community, and managed quarantine and isolation interventions;
- 7 **agreed** to provide funding of \$3.7 million per annum from July 2023 to June 2025 to progress the work agreed in paragraph 6 above;
- 8 **directed** officials to report back to SWC by 30 June 2023 with:
 - 8.1 a draft long-term quarantine and isolation capability strategy;
 - 8.2 initial investment proposals for an evolving portfolio of self, community, and managed quarantine and isolation interventions;
 - 8.3 Confidential advice to Government ;
 noted that, Confidential advice to Government
- 10 **noted** that agreement to future capital investment based on the above analysis will require a detailed business case;
- 11 noted that the Programme Business Case estimates that the ongoing annual running cost of the decision in paragraph 6 above during 'peacetime' would be between \$10.9 million and \$13.5 million per annum, and at full capacity between \$600 and \$800 million per annum and Confidential advice to Government

Transfer of responsibility for the agreed option from MBIE back to the health system

- 12 **agreed** that responsibility for progressing the decision in paragraph 6 be transferred from MBIE to the health system by no later than 30 June 2023;
- 13 directed MBIE, Manatū Hauora, and Te Whatu Ora to provide the Minister of Finance, Minister of Health, and Minister for COVID-19 Response, with a detailed transition roadmap for the above transfer of responsibility in March 2023;

Transfer of funding for the agreed option to the health system

- 14 **agreed** that the Cabinet decision noted in paragraph 2.2 above restricting the transfer of funding will no longer apply, to allow for the transfer of responsibility from MBIE to the health system before 30 June 2023;
- 15 **agreed** that the funding to progress work on New Zealand's future quarantine and isolation capability beyond 30 June 2023 may be transferred from Vote Building and Construction to Vote Health appropriations only;
